Council Bill No. 35.

An Act fixing the time for holding the terms of the District Court in the Fifth Judicial District of the Territory of New Mexico.

BE IT ENACTED by the Legislative Assembly of the Territory of New Mexico.

Section 1. The regular term of the District Court in the Fifth Judicial District of this Territory shall hereafter be held and commenced as follows: In the County of Eddy, at the County Seat of said County, commencing on the first Monday of March and the first Monday of September of each year; in the County of Roosevelt, at the County Seat of said County, commencing on the first Monday of April and the first Monday of October of each year, in the County of Chaves, at the County Seat of said County, on the third Monday of April and the third Monday of October of each year.

Section 2. Every writ, summons, subpoena, or other process whatever, which has been or may be issued or taken out from the District Court for any of said Counties in said District returnable to a regular term of Court shall be returnable at the times and places designated in Section 1 of this Act and shall have the same force and effect as if the same had been made returnable at the times and places mentioned in said Section 1 of this Act.

Section 3. That an emergency exist and that this Act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

Teachers Pass Good Resolutions.

The Educational Association of New Mexico passed some very good resolutions at their recent session at Silver City. Some of them may not be altogether practical, but they will at least help to arouse public interest in school matters. When the teachers say that it is time to do something to separate the several county superintendents from politics they are right. School conditions in this country are deplorable from that cause and some others.

The following is one of their resolutions on the subject:

"We regret that the county superintendency is regarded in most counties of the territory as a position to be filled rather by a politician than by a practical school man. If the duties of this office be confined to organizing school districts, disbursing school funds, receiving and making statistical reports, etc., it had better be abolished and some other official called upon to take charge of these affairs. Teaching is a difficult art, it requires a high degree of skill and presupposes the most careful preparation and supervision. The rural teacher, especially, needs the counsel and instruction of one who has teaching experience. To this end we appeal to the people to elect more competent men or women to this office—sober, respectable citizens as capable of performing this special function as the district attorney is capable of filling his position as such. However under present conditions we do not expect expert supervision, but persons chosen to this position should be as capable as those whom they attempt to examine and supervise."—Taos Republican.

passed both Houses yesterday is a timely and proper measure. Its provisions will bring the Territory a handsome revenue, probably \$20,000 per annum and will provide strict supervision in insurance matters, both for the protection of the people and for the best interests of all concerned. It is understood that a lobby was being gotten ready by some of the insurance people in Albuquerque to fight the measure. If this is true the lobby is too late. In addition, it is well to remark right here that lobbying in the present session does not pay very well. It is evidently the rule to put wholesome and necessary legislation on the records of the present assembly and no other. No bad or pernicious bills have as yet slipped through although one of them, Council Bill No. 44, which contained some bad provisions came very near getting through and would have succeeded except for the watchfulness and care of Governor Otero.—New Mexican.

Tallmadge Makes Record.
The severe weather of this last storm has evidently been a convincing argument that New Mexico is capable of almost anything in the weather line, and at the same time pleasing to the gentlemen from the north who came down on Tallmadge's last excursion, for the sales of land have been very gratifying. In fact, a record was made during the Saturday afternoon drive out of Dexter. In three hours 3,040 acres were sold for a total of \$94,240, averaging \$31 per acre. It is said that as the procession of carriages drove about from one piece of land to another, that the agents might show the land to bargain hunters, the land was often sold to some man in the front of the procession before the rest had driven up. This excursion was one of the largest and most successful ever conducted by the Tallmadge people.—Roswell Record.

Lincoln and the "Sweatbox."
When Lincoln visited Fortress Monroe, in 1863, his attention was called to a narrow door, bound with iron, the use of which he was anxious to learn. "What is this?" he asked. "Oh, that is the sweatbox," was the reply. "It is used for refractory sailors. A man in there is treated to a big dose of steam heat and has very little ventilation. It brings him around pretty quickly." Lincoln, ever merciful, demanded that he be allowed to try the treatment to which thousands of American sailors were subjected yearly.

Taking off his hat—for he was several inches over 6 feet in height—he entered the inclosure, which he found to be a little more than 3 feet in length or width. A signal from him the door was to be opened. It was then closed and the steam turned on. He had been inside hardly three minutes before the signal was given. President Lincoln had experienced something he had never known had existed before. Turning to Secretary Welles, of the navy department, he ordered that no such inclosure as the sweat box should ever after be allowed on any vessel flying the American flag.

Lincoln's abolition of this means of torture was followed by the navies of other countries. Great Britain, France, Germany and other Europeans heard that the sweatbox had been abolished as inhuman. One and all of these nations fell into line, and today the sweatbox is not to be found on any vessel flying the flag of civilized nation throughout the world.—Selected.

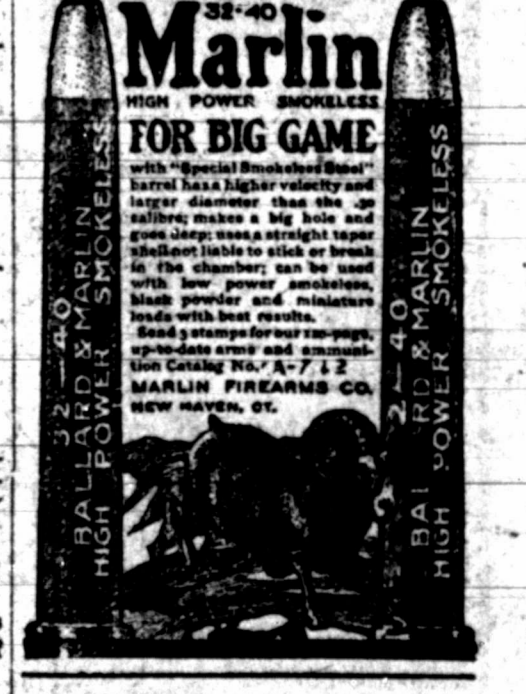
