Dying As She Danced.

Morita Kimi danced her way into the great beyond while New York society languidly cried "brave." She was the greatest little actress of Japan. Her ashes will be carried back to the home of her fathers in a golden urn. The house of Morita will go into somberly brilliant mourning and even the Mikado will sigh when he hears that the little Kimi danced her life away in New York.

She died yesterday in the little flat she and her sister, Morita Kanya, had occupied. The night before she had danced before Mrs. Stuyvesant Fish, Mrs. Astor, Mr. and Mrs. Harry Lehr, Ocirichs and scores of others in society. She had danced with the fever raging in her veins and her pulse beating above the danger point. Bending with the grace of a flower swayed by the wind, tripping to the poetic rythm of the songs of birds and smiling while her heart was tortured by the advance of a deadly malady.

Little Kimi had become the fad of the very rich and the yery swagger, for though scarcely more than a child, she had been sent to America as the representative actress of Japan. At the St. Louis Exposition she won merited popularity, for it could be seen that her whole soul was in her art and that she was a true artist. Her father. Morita, now dead, was the oldest theatrical manager in the kingdom of babies and chrysanthemums.

He was at the head of his caste and it was his life's ambition that one of his children become famous. Kanya was the oldest, but she did not develop the genius the father demanded. Kimi was taught to dance at the age of four years and in her the aging parent saw that his ambitions would be realized. The greatest masters were obtained to train the tiny child in the arts and mysteries of the dance. In Japan only those of the caste can become actors and win recognition, and only those of the caste can learn the forbidden secrets of the dance.

St. Petersburg knows nothing of the extent of the disaster, not even the lines of Gen. Kuropatkin's retreat. whether he is endeavoring to cut his way through to safety or whether, as many pessimists believe, he has taken to the mountains. If he has fled into the mountains he will inviteably be hemmed in and starved into surrender.

The disaptch from Gen. 
