

When the hand is laid flat upon the ribs of the animal and pressed against them, a mellowness and elasticity should be noticeable, which indicate ready fattener and a good quality of flesh. The animal which has a thin, wiry coat of hair, and which feels hard and unyielding when the hand is laid flesh which is desirable in a beef anisteer, but, in handling a thick-fleshed previously mentioned, is noticeable, though the animal may be compara-

tively thin. It is desirable to have good depth and thickness at the heart in order to indicate constitution; but there should indications of breeding qualities.-Prof. G. E. Day.

front teeth appear. At eighteen months there will be the ty-one to twenty-two months there will be four permanent incisors. At twenty-seven months the temporary molars drop out, and permanent ones take their place. At thirty months there

At from three years and four to st months all the eight permanent incisors have appeared and the sheep may be said to have a full mouth. After this it is not so easy to tell, but if the may take it to be between four and five years. From this time on the gen eral condition of the sheep and the good or bad state of the teeth will indicate whether the sheep can be proitably kept or not.

Gen. Kuropatkin has been dismissed and disgraced and Gen. Linevitch, commander of the first army, is appointed to succeed him in command of all the Russian land and sea forces operating against the Japanese.

Kuropatkin has been ordered to repair to St. Petersburg.

The only dispatches from the front are the brief dispatches Friday that Gen. Linevitch had assumed command and that Gen. Kuropatkin was departing for St. Petersburg, which disposes of a rumor that the latter had committed suicide.

The Russians are losing heavily in the rear guard actions, and Japanese columns are reported to be pushing northward as fast as possible to complete the envelopment of the Russian

An international credit loan of \$100. 000,000 on a 5 per cent basis is now being negotiated by the Ministry of Finance. The loan will be floated probably in a short time. The price of the issuance has not been determined upon, but probably will be 93 to 95.



SPIDER THREADS THE BEST.

For Use in Telescopes Nothing Has Been Found So Good.

The astronomer after the experience of many years has found that the spider furnishes the only thread which can be successfully used in carrying on his work, writes Ambrose Swazey, in the Scientific American.

The spider lines mostly used are from one-fifth to one-seventh of a thousandth of an inch in diameter and, in addition to their strength and elasticity, they have the peculiar property of withstanding great changes of temperature; and often when measuring the sun spots, although the heat is so intense as to crack the lenses of the micrometer, eyepiece, yet the spider lines are not in the least injured.




