The assessed valuation of Roosevelt county as far as completed is \$744,114.00 and the amount which will yet be rendered is estimated at \$50,000.00. The equalization board has raised the rendition already submitted, \$100,000.00. Should the raised schedules stand our assessed valuation for the year 1905 will be \$894,114.00, or \$390,414.00 above that of last year. This makes a good showing for a new county and one that our people may well be proud of. Our assessor has been very careful in his assessments and is entitled to no little credit for his perseverance and pains.

The local sportsmen of Portales met Thursday evening and organized a gun club. The officers are W. A. Davis, president; Chas Woodcock, treasurer; H. B. Ryther, Secretary. An invitation was extended to all who so desired to become members. In addition to the officers the members are J. B. Priddy, J. A. Fairly, J. W. Maxwell, J. S. Fitzhugh and Will Breeding. All the necessary traps and paraphernalia was purchased and arrangements made for weekly meets.

The cases against J. E. Stockton and Jarvis Stockton were dismissed this week. These cases have taken a peculiar course. First these men were put under bond to keep the peace; next they were released upon the petition of ten citizens; then they were re-arrested upon the same complaint as originally made, and the one on which they were tried, and again placed under bond. Then this week they were released and discharged entirely. These cases present very peculiar and extraordinary proceedings and were all held in the justice court.
