SOME GOOD LAWS PASSED.
The session of the territorial egislature adjourned on Friday of last week. One hundred and fifteen bills and resolutions were passed including many good laws. Probably the most important bill passed was the anti-gambling bill, which prohibits gambling in the Territory of New Mexico after the first of January, 1908.
A bill was passed providing that hereafter when any vacancy occurs in any county office in the territory, other than a vacancy in the office of county commis sioner, it shall be the duty of the board of county commissioners to fill such vacancies.
A bill was passed entitled, "An act to encourage the erection of beet sugar factories and for othe purposes."
An act providing for the porated towns and assessing the expense thereof against the owners of property abutting upon said streets," was passed.
A resolution was passed conveying the "Old Palace" at Santa Fe to the United States Government.
A bill was passed providing for the construction of an addition to the present capital building at Santa Fe.
A bill was passed entitled, "An act to prohibit expectoration upon sidewalks, public places, byways and paths in towns and village in the Territory of New Mexico and other purposes.
A resolution was passed which provided for the appointment of a joint committee to draft a registration and election law,
"An act providing for the reg istration of births and deaths,' was passed.
"An act creating the office of nspector of weights and meas ures in the several counties
the territory," was passed.

## PLOW LESS-CULTIVATE MORE

Methods of cultivation are becoming better understood. Not ong ago, corn growers 'plowed' heir corn two or three times an laid it by.' And they plowed it, too, using two big shovels to the
gang and sending them down to gang and sending them down to
the beam. Now, the custom of he best corn growers is to give the corn a light cultivation with the harrow first; then if the soil has become compacted by heavy rains as often happens, it is given one deep cultivation resembling he 'plowing' that used to be given. This deep cultivation admits air to the soil, which is nec-
essary, and does not disturb the corn roots because they have not yet developed between the rows. Later, cultivations are uni formly shallow, the second and hird with a riding cultivator which kills weeds and loosens the surface only to a depth of one to hree inches. After ihe corn is 00 high to straddle, some implement that will cultivate the space vetween two rows is used. All that desired is to keep the surface oose down to a depth of one to
