compared with what they received last year. This list shows that Portales was reduced from $\$ 1400$ to $\$ 1300$. This is an error, so we are informed by

Furthermore, the business of this post office for the last year only lacked twenty dollars of being enough to have made the salary $\$ 1700$ for the next year.
