An extensive test of growing sugar beets ought to be made in Roosevelt county this year. Sugar beets can be grown here and if the industry can be started and made a success it will bring the farmers more money than any other crop that can be grown in this country and will greatly advance the value of real estate.

There are a few, only a few, residences in Portales that last summer were surrounded by as fine a grass lawn as could be found in any town. This is a demonstration that we can have beautiful yards and to have a beautiful town we should have grass and flowers in every yard. We need more trees. We ought to appoint an arbor day this spring and everybody turn out and plant trees which would include a row of trees along each side of every residence street.

Every person has an indistinct idea of some great thing in store for them some time in the future. Upon this hope they strive through the toil of daily life and any success that is attained seems commonplace in comparison with this great achievement they are going to attain sometime. But before people have time to even make up their minds what this wonderful thing is they pass to the other shore where probably they will also be doomed to disappointment.

A 550 acre tract of land near Eton, Colorado, that a few years ago could have been bought for \$10 an acre, has been so greatly improved by dry farming and development of the surrounding country by dry farming, that it sold this week to Illinois parties for \$39,750. In a few years, the same increment of values in dry farming lands will be noted in New Mexico, for the day is passing when a good homestead can be had upon it.—New

Growth of New Mexico.

The Santa Fe New Mexican, which is always first and foremost in ably boosting for New Mexico, gives some very interesting facts about the advancement and development of our beloved territory during the past year. One thing shown is that our population has more than doubled since 1900, which in comparison with the increase of population in other states or territories puts us way in the lead. Wonderful development in the way of irrigation projects have been made and the value of agricultural products produced last year is more than three times that of 1900. The New Mexican gives some expressive paragraphs from an interview of Governor Curry in the Denver Post as follows:

"The territory of New Mexico is proud of her achievements in 1908. Her coal mines produced 2,530,000 tons of coal, and 225,000 tons of coke; her lumber mills turned out over 100,000,000 feet of lumber; the territory's wealth increased \$25,000,000.

"We have a population of 500,000. Homeseekers are coming into the territory at the rate of 75,000 per year, and about two thirds of this number come from the farming communities of the North Central states. For 1908 the assessed valuation of property is approximately \$52,000,000.

"The lieu-land bill passed by congress this year gives New Mexico 960,000 acres of land for her public schools.

"Intensive farming is being successfully inaugurated in our prairie counties; this is the land of the sugar beet, and sugar beet factories will be under construction here in the near future. Cantaloupe growing is an important industry in the Mesilla valley.

"Silk worms have been imported from Italy by an Italian colony near Albuquerque, where the silk industry is in its experimental stage.

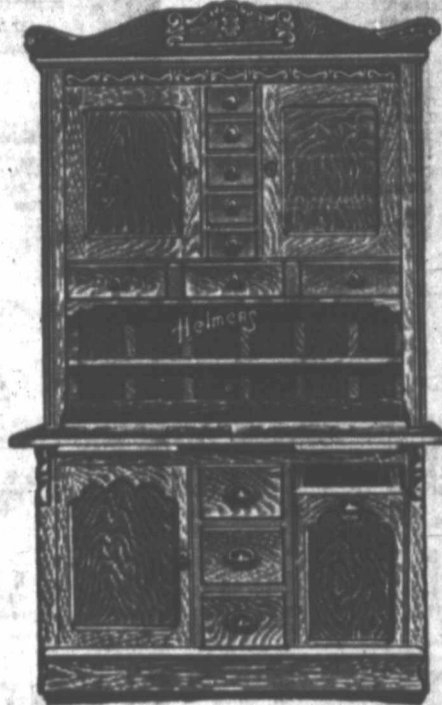
"We have here about 5,000,000 head of sheep, and the wool clip for 1908 amounted to 18,000,000 pounds. About 100,000 head of cattle were shipped out of the territory during the past year, which is a smaller shipment than usual. The New Mexico angora goat has won first honors in various national live stock shows.

"The irrigation plants now in the course of construction will irrigate 500,000 acres of land and will cost in the neighborhood of \$15,000,000. The elephant Butte dam, in Southern New Mexico which, when completed, will be the largest storage reservoir in the world is now under construction by the reclamation service.

"During the recent financial crisis not a single bank in New Mexico closed its doors; on the contrary, a number of new banks were established. Two hundred corporations were organized, and fifty admitted on charters from other commonwealths. The total capitalization amounts to \$88,000,000.

"Five armories are now under construction in different cities of the territory; a handsome annex to the territorial capitol is well under way, and substantial additions are being built to our various educational institutions."

McConney, and was drilled by Sam Stromme, both old oil well men, and they say this is by far the best thing of the kind ever struck in the Pecos Valley.

There is considerable excitement among our citizens, and numbers of men have visited the well and examined the oil, and without exception they all pronounce this the best prospect ever struck in this section. We are informed that an effort will be made at once to develop this well into a producer.
