ORDINANCES

Of the Town of Portales, Roosevelt County, New Mexico.

ORDINANCE NO. 3.

CITY OFFICERS—DUTIES AND POWERS.

Be it ordained by the Board of Trustees of the town of Portales, New Mexico:

Section 1. That each and every officer of the town of Portales, whether elected or appointed, shall, before entering upon the duties of his office, take and subscribe an oath that he will well and truly perform all the duties of his office to the best of his skill and ability, and that he will support the constitution of the United States and the laws of the territory of New Mexico, and said oath shall be in the form prescribed by law.

Sec. 2. The officers of said town of Portales shall consist of five trustees one of whom shall be chairman, a town clerk, a town treasurer, a town attorney, a town marshal, a town physician, a pound keeper, and a scavenger.

Sec. 3. There shall be nominated by the town trustees, at the first meeting after election of such board, or as soon thereafter as practicable, one chairman of the board of trustees, one town clerk, one town treasurer, one town marshal, one town attorney and one town physician, who shall hold their offices, respectively, for the term of one (1) year, and until their successors shall be appointed and qualified, unless sooner removed.

Sec. 4. The officers hereinafter mentioned shall, before entering upon the duties of their respective offices, execute bonds to the town of Portales, with securities to be approved by the board of trustees, conditioned that they will faithfully perform the duties of their respective offices, and that they will, when they vacate their respective offices, surrender and turn over to their successors all moneys, books, papers, property and other things in their custody or control belonging to the town. The penalties of the bonds, as required by this section, shall be as follows:

- For town clerk, the sum of one thousand dollars (\$1000.00)
- For town treasurer, five thousand dollars (\$5000.00)
- For town marshal, twenty-five hundred dollars (\$2,500.00)
- For town scavenger, two hundred and fifty dollars (\$250.00)
- For pound keeper, five hundred dollars (\$500.00)

And the board of trustees may require a bond from any town official and fix the amount therefor when, in their judgement, the same is necessary. Said bonds shall be filed with the clerk of said board, and by him be preserved and kept in some secure place, subject, however, at all times, to the inspection of the said board of trustees, and that of any tax payer of the town who shall desire to examine the same, and shall be recorded in a book kept for that purpose.

TOWN TREASURER.

Sec. 5. The treasurer shall receive all moneys belonging to the corporation, and shall keep his books and accounts in such a manner as may be prescribed by ordinance, and such books and accounts shall always be subject to the inspection of any member of the board of trustees. He shall keep a separate account of each fund or appropriation and the debits or credits belonging thereto. He shall give every person paying money into the treasury a receipt therefor, specifying the date of payment and upon what account paid, and he shall file statements of such receipts with the clerk at the date of each monthly report. He shall, at the end of each and every month, and oftener, if required, render an account to the board of trustees, or such officer as may be designated by ordinance, showing the state of the treasury. He shall also accompany such accounts with a statement of all moneys received into the treasury, and upon what account, during the preceding month, together with all warrants redeemed and paid by him, which said warrants with any and all vouchers held by him, shall be delivered to the clerk and filed with his said account, in the clerk's office, upon every day of such statement. He shall return all warrants paid by him stamped or marked "paid." He shall keep a register of all warrants redeemed and, which shall describe such warrants and show the date, amount, number, the fund from which paid, the name of the person to whom paid and when paid. He may be required to keep all moneys in his hands belonging to the corporation in such place of deposit as may be designated by ordinance; provided, however, no such ordinance shall be passed by which the custody of such money shall be taken from the treasurer. The treasurer shall keep all moneys, belonging to the corporation, in his hands, separate and distinct from his own moneys, and he is hereby expressly prohibited from using, either directly or indirectly the corporation money or warrants in his hands for his own use or benefit, or that of any other person or persons, whomsoever.

Any violation of this provision shall subject him to immediate removal from office by the board of trustees, who are hereby authorized to declare said office vacant, and in which case his successor shall be appointed by the board of trustees and shall hold his office for the remainder of the unexpired term.

Sec. 6. He shall report to the board of trustees, as often as required, a full and detailed account of all receipts and expenditures of the corporation, as shown by his books, up to the time of his report, and he shall, annually, between the first and tenth of April, make out and file with the clerk, a full and detailed account of all such receipts and expenditures, and all his transactions as such treasurer during the preceding fiscal year, which account the clerk shall immediately cause to be published in a newspaper printed in the town.

Sec. 7. All warrants drawn on the treasurer must be signed by the chairman of the board of trustees and countersigned by the clerk, stating the particular fund or appropriation to which the same is chargeable, and the person to whom payable, and no money shall be drawn except as hereinafter provided. All moneys received on any special assessment shall be held by the treasurer as a special fund to be applied to the payment of the improvement for which the assessment was made, and said money shall be used for no other purpose, whatever, unless to reimburse such corporation for money spent for such improvements.

Sec. 8. The treasurer shall have and keep in his office a book to be called the "Registry of Town Warrants," where shall be entered and set down every town warrant, and the date of the presentation thereof, and without any interval of blank lines between any such entry and the one preceding it. Such registry of town warrants shall be open, at all reasonable hours, to the inspection of any person desiring to inspect or examine the same.

TOWN CLERK.

Sec. 9. It shall be the duty of the town clerk to record all proceedings of the board of trustees in a book, or books, provided for that purpose. He shall countersign all warrants drawn upon the treasurer under the town seal. He shall make out all licenses authorized by the ordinances of the town and countersign the same under the town seal and, before issuing any license or warrant, shall present the same to the chairman of the board of trustees for his signature and approval. He shall keep a full and complete record of all warrants and licenses issued, with the names of the parties in whose favor they are drawn, including dates, amounts and numbers, and purposes for which given, and shall, on the first day of each month, or as soon thereafter as the same can be completed, and at such other time as the board of trustees may require, prepare a full and complete report of all warrants and licenses issued, also of all moneys collected belonging to the town treasurer, and of all other transactions of his said office during the month last preceding the said report, and shall submit the same to the board of trustees at its first regular meeting in each and every month. The town clerk shall be the keeper of the town seal and shall affix it to all instruments which are required to be attested by the town seal; he shall have custody of and safely keep all records and documents of the town, except as are otherwise provided by law. The town clerk shall receive a salary of twenty-five (\$25.00) dollars per month and, in addition to such salary, shall be allowed twenty-five (25) cents for each license or notice issued.

TOWN ATTORNEY.

Sec. 10. The town attorney shall, at the time of his appointment, be a resident and a qualified elector of the town of Portales, a member of the bar in good standing, and admitted to the practice of law in the courts of the territory of New Mexico.

Sec. 11. That the town attorney shall, if in the town, attend the regular and special sessions of the board of trustees; he shall give his opinion on legal questions, verbally or in writing, to the board of trustees, chairman, or any member whenever requested; he shall advise when applied to, any officer of the town as to the conduct of his office and he shall prepare and pass upon the legality of all ordinances, contracts, bonds and other writings, affecting the interest of the town. The town attorney shall by virtue of his office represent the town as its attorney in all suits in the justice courts and district court to which it is a party, including cases appealed from the justice court, and for his services so rendered shall receive a salary of twenty-five dollars per month.

Sec. 12. That the town attorney shall represent the town as its attorney in all suits and proceedings to which it is a party in the supreme court of New Mexico, and for services so rendered he shall be paid just and reasonable fees and compensation, to be fixed by the board of trustees in each instance of service. Provided, that whenever the town attorney, by reason of interest or other reason is disqualified, or because or any disability should not be able to attend any such suit or proceeding, other counsel

may be employed to represent said town, and it shall be at the option of the board of trustees at all times, to employ, assistant, additional or other counsel if deemed advisable.

Sec. 13. In addition to the salary provided in Section 11, the town attorney for each conviction of a breach of ordinance secured in the justice court on a plea of not guilty shall receive a fee of five dollars and where a plea of guilty is entered a fee of two dollars, which fee shall in either case be assessed and collected as other costs are assessed and collected. The town attorney is hereby authorized and empowered to make or execute any bond or affidavit in the name of the town of Portales, signing the same, as town attorney, that may be necessary in any suit or proceeding in which the town may be a party.

Sec. 14. The town attorney shall have the right to be heard upon all questions or motions before the board of trustees, amending, repealing or in any way affecting any ordinance in force or to be enacted by the board of trustees when the legality of such action or proposed action shall be called in question.

Sec. 15. It shall be the duty of the town marshal to serve all processes which shall be lawfully directed to him. It shall be his duty to see that all ordinances and regulations passed by the board of trustees are promptly and effectually enforced. He shall obey all orders of the chairman and board of trustees and attend all meetings of the board. It shall be his duty with or without process to apprehend any person found disturbing the peace or offending against any ordinance of the town and forthwith take such person before the justice of the peace to be dealt with as provided by ordinance.

Sec. 16. That at each regular meeting of the board of trustees said marshal shall report to the board of trustees all fines and fees collected by him since the last regular meeting, and all justice court fees shall thereupon be credited and paid to said justice of the peace by the town treasurer.

Sec. 17. That the hours when said marshal shall go on and off watch shall be under the control and at the direction of the board of trustees.

Sec. 18. The marshal is hereby authorized to arrest any person violating, in his presence, or whom he has reasonable cause to believe has violated any law of the United States or the territory of New Mexico, or any ordinance of said town, and upon arrest being made, the officer making the arrest shall, as soon as practicable, make or cause to be made, a complaint before the proper judicial officer for the issuance of a warrant for the apprehension or detention of the person arrested.

Sec. 19. All fines and costs collected by the marshal of said town shall be paid by him to the town treasurer at least once a week, and return the execution of commitment for the collection of said fine and costs satisfied, and in all cases it shall be the duty of said justice of the peace to issue such execution or commitment and endorse thereon an itemized statement of costs, and it shall be the duty of said marshal to make a report to the board of trustees at each regular meeting of all arrests made, of all cases tried, for violation of town ordinances, of the disposition of the same, and of fines and costs collected and uncollected.

Sec. 20. The marshal shall receive such salary as the board of trustees shall, by resolution, fix, the amount of which is hereby fixed at fifty (\$50.00) per month, and shall be paid to him in warrants, drawn upon the general fund.

Sec. 21. In addition to the compensation which may be allowed the marshal of the town of Portales by the board of trustees as salary, he shall be entitled to demand and receive the following fees: For serving any warrant or attachment, \$1.00; against any witness or party to the suit, for each defendant and making return, 50 cents; for taking a party to jail upon commitment on order of the justice of the peace, 75 cents; for making an arrest without a warrant and carrying the arrested party before the justice of the peace and making, or causing to be made, a complaint in writing of the charge for which such party was arrested, for each defendant, \$1.00; for serving a subpoena or any written notice, for each party, 50 cents; for serving any notice, written or oral, or executing any order of the board, 50 cents for each person served, where there are not more than four persons to be notified of the same matter, if more than four, 25 cents for each person notified, and for license collected, 25 cents. In all cases where the fee is not herein provided, the marshal shall be entitled to demand and receive the same as are now allowed constables under the laws of New Mexico.

Sec. 22. The justice of the peace of said town shall, before proceeding to try any person for the violation of any ordinance of said town, cause complaint to be made, and warrant to issue to arrest said person, and return to be made on said warrant.

Sec. 23. All cases tried before said justice of the peace shall be docketed in the name of said town of Portales against the defendant, and said justice of the peace shall enter on said docket, in plain, intelligible manner, a minute of each step taken in such case, and of particular costs assessed in same.

Sec. 24. Judgment shall be entered in each and every case of guilty or not guilty of the offense charged, and by said judgment defendant shall be discharged, fined or imprisoned, or fined and imprisoned, as the case may be; and where defendant is found guilty, the cost of such case shall be assessed against him, and no cost shall be taxed otherwise; and all judgments imposing a fine except where a fine and imprisonment are both imposed, shall be the alternative of imprisonment for a specified number of days, until such fine and costs are paid, in default of immediate payment of such fine and costs.

Sec. 25. Where judgment of guilty shall be entered in any case before him, said justice of the peace shall issue a commitment against the person of defendant, commanding the marshal of said town, in default of immediate payment of such fine and costs as may have been assessed, to commit the defendant to the town or county jail, subject to labor in accordance with the terms of said judgment and the ordinances of said town of Portales.

Sec. 26. Whenever, in accordance with the laws of said territory, defendant in any case may be entitled to an appeal, the same shall be allowed in accordance therewith, by filing bond, with two sufficient securities in double the amount of the highest pecuniary penalty that could or might be assessed in such case. Provided, that said appeal shall not operate as a supersedeas in such case until such bond shall have been given and approved, and no costs shall be demanded as a condition of such appeal, nor the approval of said appeal bond.

Sec. 27. That the justice of the peace of the town of Portales shall be entitled to demand and receive for his services the following fees, to-wit: For issuing each warrant \$1.00; for docketing each case, 50 cents; for entering judgment in each case, 50 cents; for presiding at trial, 50 cents; for taking and certifying to an oath of acknowledgment, on behalf of the town or any officer or its order, 50 cents. In all cases where the fee is not herein provided the justice of the peace shall be entitled to demand and receive the fees

as are now allowed justices of the peace under the laws of New Mexico.

Sec. 28. In all cases where the defendant pleads guilty, or a conviction on a plea of not guilty, the costs shall be assessed against and collected from the defendant, unless defendant be committed, when the town of Portales will pay the costs.

CITY PHYSICIAN.

Sec. 29. The board of trustees shall appoint a competent physician who shall be known as the town physician, and shall hold office until his successor is appointed and qualified. He shall reside within the corporate limits of the town of Portales, and shall receive such compensation as the board of trustees may fix.

Sec. 30. It shall be the duty of the town physician to attend professionally, the indigent sick of the town free of charge; to report to the board of trustees all infractions of the ordinances in relation to the public health, and to perform such other services in the line of his profession as the board of trustees shall direct.

Sec. 31. It shall be the duty of the town physician to assist the board of trustees, or any committee thereof, to enforce the provisions of the health and sanitary ordinances, and all laws, making, enforcing and establishing all necessary rules and regulations regarding the sanitary condition of the town; to attend all meetings of the board of trustees, when requested, and advise the said board of trustees upon all matters pertaining to the health of the community, and he shall attend such cases of sickness as are under the care and supervision of the town as paupers and, in general, to do such things as may be required of him by the ordinances of the town of Portales and the regulations of the board of trustees.

Sec. 32. The board of trustees shall cause a thorough inspection of the town by the town physician at least once every thirty days, and he shall, at each regular meeting of the board of trustees, submit a report in writing of the sanitary condition of the town, stating the location of all nuisances prejudicial to the public health, source of filth and causes of sickness, the number of persons having contagious or infectious diseases of any kind, and the character of such diseases, together with a report of his action in the premises.

SCAVENGER.

Sec. 33. That there is hereby created the office of town scavenger, who shall be appointed by the board of trustees. Said town scavenger shall, before entering upon the duties of his office, file an oath with the town clerk, to faithfully perform the duties of said office, and he shall enter into a good and sufficient bond in the sum of two hundred and fifty (\$250.00) dollars, conditioned to faithfully perform the duties of said office, and he shall be liable to any resident of the town of Portales upon said bond, who may be injured or inconvenienced by the non-performance of his duties.

Sec. 34. It shall be the duty of said scavenger to remove from the town to a point not less than one mile from the limits thereof, all of the filth, trash, excrement, etc., under the provisions and in accordance with the sanitary ordinance. And he shall perform such other duties as provided by ordinance.

POUND KEEPER.

Sec. 35. At any regular meeting of the board of trustees said board may elect a pound keeper, whose duty it shall be to take and safely keep any animals found running at large within the limits of the town of Portales. But, before the pound keeper shall enter upon the duties of his office, he shall file an oath of office and execute a good and sufficient bond in the penal sum of five hundred (\$500.00) dollars to the town of Portales, conditioned upon the faithful performance of the duties of his office. And said pound keeper may be removed at any time by a proper vote of the board of trustees. He shall receive such compensation per month as the board of trustees may allow. Any vacancy occurring, at any time, for any cause in the office of pound keeper may be filled at any regular meeting or at any special meeting called for that purpose.

Sec. 36. The pound keeper shall receive the following fees for the care and keeping of the animals taken and impounded by him, to-wit: For each animal impounded, 50 cents; for each animal sold, 50 cents; for the care and keeping of each horse, mule or neat cattle, per day, 50 cents; for the care and keeping of each burro, goat or hog, per day, 50 cents. Any animal fed night and morning shall be deemed to have been held one day and liable to full charge per day; and only the proper proportion of the fee provided per day shall be charged according to the number of times such animal has been fed.

The 320 Acre Homestead Act.

The act providing for privilege of filing on 320 acre homesteads in the western states and territories passed and was signed by the President February 20th. The following is the substance of the bill as published in the daily papers.

Section 1. That any person who is a qualified entryman under the homestead laws of the United States may enter, by legal subdivisions, under the provisions of this act, in the states of Colorado, Montana, Nevada, Oregon, Utah, Washington and Wyoming and the territories of Arizona and New Mexico, 320 acres, or less, of non mineral, non irrigable, unreserved and unappropriated surveyed public lands which do not contain merchantable timber, located in a reasonably compact body, not over one and one half miles in extreme length: Provided, that no lands shall be subject to entry under the provisions of this act until such lands shall have been designated by the secretary of the interior, as not being, in his opinion, susceptible to irrigation at a reasonable cost from any known source of water supply.

Sec. 2. That any person applying to enter land under the provisions of this act, shall make and subscribe before the proper officer an affidavit as required by section 2290 of the revised statutes, and in addition thereto shall make affidavit that the land sought to be entered is of the character described in section 1 of this act, and shall pay the fees now required to be paid under the homestead laws.

Sec. 3. That any homestead entryman of lands of the character herein described, upon which final proof has not been made, shall have the right to enter public lands, subject to the provisions of this act, contiguous to his former entry which shall not, together with the original entry exceed 320 acres, and residence upon and cultivation of the original entry shall be deemed as residence upon and cultivation of the additional entry.

Sec. 4. That at the time of making final proofs, as provided in section 2291 of the revised statutes, the entryman under this act shall, in addition to the proofs and affidavits required under the said section, prove by two credible witnesses that at least one eighth of the area embraced in his entry was continuously cultivated to agricultural crops other than native grasses beginning with the second year of the entry, and that at least one fourth of the area embraced in the entry was so continuously cultivated beginning with the third year of the entry.

Sec. 5. That nothing herein contained shall be held to affect the right of a qualified entryman to make homestead entry in the states named in section 1 of this act, under the provisions of sec-

2289 of the revised statutes, but no person who has made entry under this act shall be entitled to make homestead entry under the provisions of said section, and no entry under this act shall be commuted.

Sec. 6. That whenever the secretary of the interior shall find that any tract of land in the state of Utah is subject to entry under this act, do not have upon them such a sufficient supply of water suitable for domestic purposes as would make continuous residence upon the lands impossible, he may, in his discretion, designate such tracts of land, not to exceed in the aggregate 2,000,000 acres, and thereafter they shall be subject to entry under this act without the necessity of residence; Provided, that in such event the entryman on any such entry shall in good faith cultivate not less than one eighth of the entire area the second year, one fourth during the third year and one half during the fourth years after the date of such entry, and that after entry and until final proof the entryman shall reside within such distance of said land as will enable him successfully to farm the same, as required by this section.

Ordinance of the Town of Portales, Roosevelt County, New Mexico.
ORDINANCE NO. 6.

An ordinance to prohibit the running at large of animals in the town of Portales, New Mexico, and for other purposes.
Be it ordained by the board of trustees of the town of Portales, New Mexico.

Section 1. Whenever any cows or other cattle, horses, mules, geldings, mules, jacks, jennets, colts, goats, sheep, pigs or dogs, shall be found running at large within this town, it shall be the duty of the town pound keeper to take up the same, and properly take care of such animals and forthwith file his affidavit with the Justice of the Peace, stating therein the seizure number, description (by marks if any there be,) and probable value thereof; whereupon the Justice of the Peace shall issue his warrant, directing the said town pound keeper, after giving notice as hereinafter provided, to sell at public auction at the place of stabling, for cash in hand to the highest bidder all stock enumerated in this section so stabled, and of his proceedings make due return.

Section 2. Upon receiving such warrant the town pound keeper shall give notice of such stabling by posting three written notices, one in the post-office, one upon the door of the county clerk and recorder's office, and one at the office of the Justice of the Peace, in the said town, and by advertisement in the official newspaper of said town for three consecutive days, if a daily paper, and one insertion of a weekly paper, setting forth the day of the seizure, the number and description (by marks, if any such there be,) of the animals stabled; and that by virtue of said warrant he will make sale thereof at the time and place therein mentioned, unless the same shall be claimed and ownership proven within ten days next following the notice.

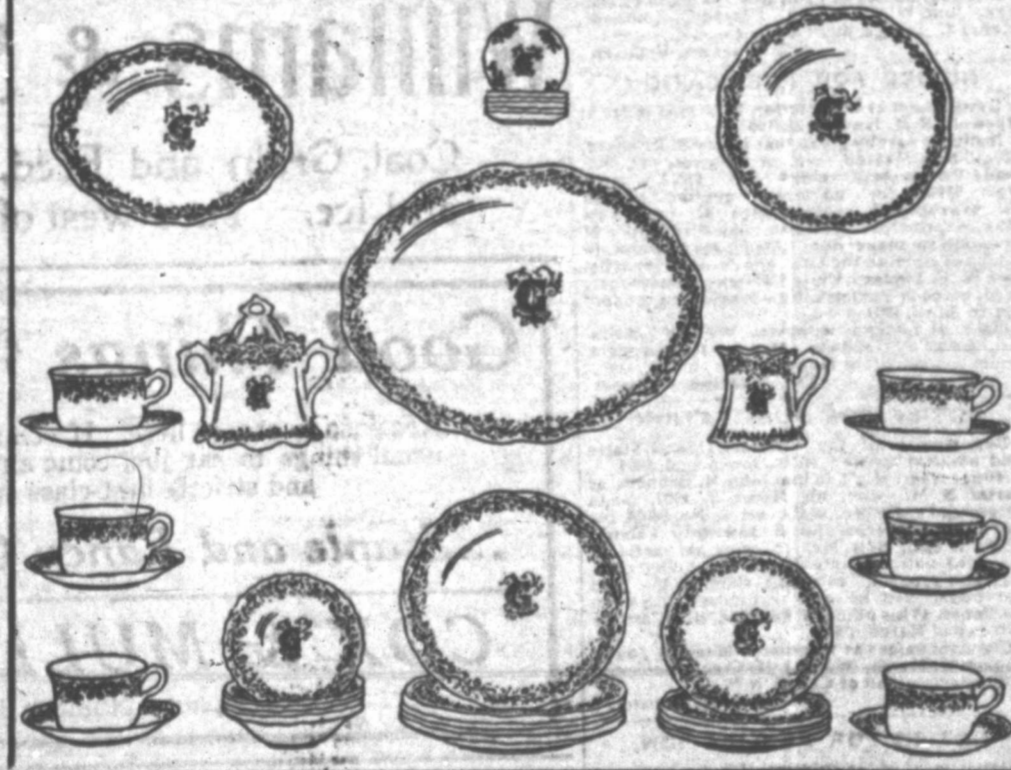
Section 3. If on or before the tenth day from date of said notice, any person shall make satisfactory proof to the town pound keeper that the stock so stabled, as provided for in this ordinance, belonged to him, her or them, or to some person or persons for whom, he, she or they may be the lawful agent, and shall pay all the costs and expenses incurred by such taking up, stabling, advertising, etc., the town pound keeper shall deliver such stock to such owner or agent.

Section 4. All animals enumerated in this ordinance remaining stabled or impounded after ten days notice of such impounding or stabling shall have been given, shall be sold by the town pound keeper as commanded by the warrant, and after deducting the costs and expenses provided for by this ordinance, the residue of the proceeds of such sale by the town pound keeper shall be paid into the town treasury by the town pound keeper.

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Ordinances of the Town of Portales, Roosevelt County, New Mexico.

ORDINANCE NO. 7.

An ordinance providing for the licensing of dogs, prohibiting them from running at large, and for other purposes.

Be it ordained by the board of trustees of the town of Portales, New Mexico.

Section 1. That no dog, bitch or whelp, shall be permitted or allowed to run or be at large within the town of Portales, unless the owner, keeper or person in charge of any such dog, bitch or whelp shall, before the fifteenth day of March in each and every year, pay to the town clerk, for the use and benefit of the town; the sum of one dollar for each and every male dog, and three dollars for each and every female dog owned or kept by such person, and shall also place and cause to remain upon the neck of every dog, bitch or whelp, a collar made of durable material, with the number designating such dog, bitch or whelp, legibly engraved thereon, or have attached thereto the tag furnished by the clerk, containing the number of said dog.

Sec. 2. Whenever the chairman of the board of town trustees shall be of the opinion that any danger of hydrophobia exists in the town he shall issue his proclamation requiring all persons within the town to confine their dogs, if they have any, for such time as he may designate, during which time it shall not be lawful for any dog, bitch or whelp to run at large within the limits of the town, unless the mouth be securely muzzled with a wire muzzle, and it shall be the duty of the marshal, and all other police officers to kill and destroy, or cause to be killed or destroyed, any dog, bitch or whelp which may be found running at large during the time designated as aforesaid, unless muzzled as above provided, and the owner or keeper thereof, shall forfeit and pay to said town the sum of five dollars for each dog, bitch or whelp found running at large contrary to the provisions of this ordinance.

Sec. 3. Any person, or persons, who shall molest, interrupt, hinder or prevent the marshal, or any police officer, in the discharge of any duty herein prescribed, shall forfeit and pay to said town a sum not less than five nor more than twenty-five dollars for each offense.

Sec. 4. If the owner or keeper of any slut shall permit or allow the same to run or be at large while in heat, he shall forfeit and pay to said town the sum of five dollars; and it shall be the duty of the marshal to kill such slut if she be found running at large in this town while in heat.

Sec. 5. It is hereby made the duty of all persons on or before the 15th day of March in each year, to apply to the town clerk and make payment to him as required in section 1; and it shall be the duty of said clerk, upon the payment of his fee together with license fee aforesaid, to issue a license to any owner, keeper or person having in charge of any such dog, bitch or whelp, for one year, and the clerk shall keep a record of the owner of the dog so licensed.

Sec. 6. Every owner, keeper or person in charge of any such dog, bitch or whelp, who shall permit the same to run at large contrary to the provisions of this ordinance, shall forfeit and pay to the said town a penalty of five dollars for each offense. It shall be the duty of the marshal and all police officers and such other persons or officers as may be detailed by the town chairman to take up and place in confinement in some place to be provided for that purpose, all dogs, bitches or whelps found running at large in said town contrary to the provisions of this ordinance, and no such dog, bitch or whelp shall be discharged or released from such place of confinement unless the owner or keeper thereof shall pay to the person having the same in charge the sum of one dollar extra, which is to be paid to the town treasury, and one dollar to the officer taking up the dog.

Sec. 7. Whenever any such dog, bitch or whelp has been confined as aforesaid for the space of forty-eight hours, and no owner or keeper applies for the release of the same, as aforesaid, it shall be the duty of the person in charge of the place mentioned in the preceding section to kill and remove the same, and bury, burn or destroy them with the refuse matter of the city.

Sec. 8. It shall be the duty of the town marshal of said town or other person designated by the town trustees for that purpose to kill all vicious dogs running at large within the limits of the town.

Sec. 9. A vicious dog is hereby defined to be a dog that bites people upon the streets or any public places, or a dog that runs and barks at horses being ridden or driven upon the streets. It shall be unlawful for a vicious dog to run at large, and such dog shall be liable to be killed, as provided in the preceding section, notwithstanding such dog has been licensed under the provisions of this ordinance.

Sec. 10. All unlicensed dogs, bitches and whelps, running at large within the limits of the town of Portales, and owned in said town, and all dogs, bitches and whelps defined to be vicious under this ordinance, and any slut running at large in said corporation while in heat, dogging, or chased or followed by dog or dogs, be and each, all and every one of them hereby is and are declared to be common nuisances, offensive alike to public order and well-being, which may be suppressed and abated by any officer under the provisions of this ordinance. The town marshal is authorized to collect the dog tax herein mentioned.

ORDINANCE NO. 8.

An ordinance amending ordinance No. 5 of the ordinances of the town of Portales, concerning licenses.

Be it ordained by the board of trustees of the town of Portales, New Mexico:

Section 1. That ordinance No. 5 be, and the same is hereby amended as follows, to-wit: By striking out the seventh line of section 5 thereof, to-wit: the words and figures "retail dry goods and grocery stores \$24.00," and by changing the license designated in said section for retail dry goods stores from \$20.00 to \$50.00, and by changing the license therein designated for retail grocery stores from \$16.00 to \$24.00; and by changing the license therein designated for drug stores from \$16.00 to \$24.00; and by changing the license therein designated for news stands from \$12.00 to \$6.00; and by changing the license therein designated for lumber yards from \$80.00 to \$50.00; and by striking out the words "or feed yard" from the license therein designated for livery stable or feed yard \$20.00; and by striking out the words and figures therein as follows, to-wit: "wholesale and retail hardware store \$60.00;" and by striking out the words and figures therein as follows: "bowling alley \$50.00;" and by adding thereto and therein, wagon and feed yard \$12.00; and by adding thereto and therein, knife rack or shooting gallery, \$16.00.
