

Any fine collected under the provisions of this ordinance shall be paid to the treasurer of the fire department for the use of said fire department.

Sec. 10. It shall be the duty of the companies under the supervision of their officers, to keep the hose and all fire apparatus clean and in good working order, at all times, and at fires cause the same to be managed skillfully and effectively for the extinguishment of such fires. The hook and ladder company shall discharge the customary duties of hook and ladder men at fires. It shall be the duty of the hose company to act as hosemen, to attend to taking the hose to fires, manage and protect it while there, and, after the fire is extinguished to properly put it in its right place; and all companies shall shall perform such other duties as are necessary or may be required by the chief, his assistant, or foreman of their respective companies. of their respective companies.




