By Practically a Unanimous Vote the Citizens of Portales Declare for the lssuance of the Bonds and the Installation of a Water, Light and Sewerage System. This Means the Beginning of a New Epoch in Our History the Laying Aside of Personal Differences and Close Combination of all the Talent and Business Sagacity of the City in a Mighty Effort for Civic Development. Already Plans end Specifications are Being Prepared for the Erection of Numerous NewBusiness Blocks. Simultaneous With the Glad Tidings of the Booster' Vietory Capital Gets Busy, New Projects Spring Into Life, an Added Impetus is Immediately Discernable, Large Real Estate Transactions are Made and a General Business Revival Follows the Previous Inactivity.

For the first time in the history of Portales, our people have otten together, have buried the hatchet, as it were, and have anited all their efforts for the future agrandizement and prosperity of the city. The occasion of this getting together was the proposal to issue bonds in the sum of $\$ 75,000.00$ for the construction of a system of water works, a sewerage system and an electric ighting plant. When this matter was first proposed there was carcely one fifth of the people who were in favor of the bond ssue yet, when the votes were counted Tuesday night, but six allots out of the total of one hundred and fifty had been cast gainst the proposition, thus giving the proposal, practically, the manimous endorsement of the entire citizenship. The advantages that will acerue from this getting together of our people should not be confined to this bond election, but should be fostered and neouraged until the habit becomes permanent and fixed. Imediately following the announcement by the election officers of he overwhelming victory for the bonds, a committee, headed by C. V. Harris, waited on W. E. Lindsey, chairman of the board of rustees, with a request for a proclamation granting te certain of the enthusiastic "boosters" permission to celebrate their victory with the customary discharge of anvils. The official pronuncia-
mento was speedily obtained and the jollification was pulled off in nento was speedily obtained a

line to building dams or reservoirs along waterways. Now the proposition has been brought up that there are lands having favor-
able climate and fertile soil but not accessible to streims, yet havable climate and fertile soil but not accessible to streims, yet having an abundance of water at a shallow depth that can be economically pumped for irrigating purposes, such being the condition in the vicinity of Portales. This proposition has great merit for de-
velopment of the country and consequently the government is beveiopment of the country and consequentiy the goverament in to peopla the plish irrigation by pumping.

This can be most economically done by using electrie power. The plan is to put in an electric power plant at some central point The plan is to put in an electric power piant at some cental point and the eiectricity be conducted to the farms where
may have his wells and electric motar, arrange his ditches, and do may have his welis and eiectric motar, It is fully believed that irrigation can be carried on in this way with equal suecess and no
res greater cost than under the reservoir projects.

A proposition of this kind at Deming is being considered by the reclamation service. Portales has the most favorable conditions for this proposition in this territory and our people are now
at work in an active effort to secure government ald in eitablishing an electrical power plant at Portales or vicinity. A bill has been introduced in Congress by Delegate Andrews for this purpose as follows:
For the purchase of a site and the erection of an electrie power plant for irrigation purposes in Portales, New Mexico, or vicinity.
Be it inacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, That the Secretary of the Treasury be, and he is herely, authorized and directed to expend the sum of three hundred thousand dollars towards the selection of a site and the construction of an electrical power plant, for irrigation purposes, to be erected in Portales, New Mexico, or vicinity; total cost of site and construction of plant not to exceed the sum of three hundred thoustand dollars.

See. 2. That the purchase of the site and the construction of the plant be under the direction and supervision of the Director of the Reclamation Service.
However, the reclamation service has power and money to eetablish a proposition of this kind without special action of congress and Delegate Andrews reccommends that, in order to pecure
quicker action, we take the matter up with F. H. Newell, Washington, D. C., chief of the reclamation service.

When a fence is constructed of barbed wire and posts, there shall be not less than four wires well stretched and firmly fastened to the posts, the top one at least four feet from the ground and the bottom wire not more than one foot from the ground, the wires not to be over twelve inches apart. The posts not to be over twenty feet apart and firmly set in the apart and firmly set in the ground to a depth of at least two ground to a depth of at least two inches in diameter at thè smaller end. When the posts are more shall be stays four feet there and at least one inch thick firmly fastened to the wires not more than eight feet apart. Sec. 2. When the fence is constructed of lumber and posts the boards shall be at least one inch thick and six inches wide with posts as described in section one not over eight feet apart and firmly set in the ground as described in section one. When the fence is constructed of poles and posts the posts shall not be more than twelve feet apart and of the same size and set in the ground as described in section one.
