BIGGER, BETTER AND STONGER

Each New Well Furnishes More Water Than the One Before

The pump was started on the Elliott well, at Bethel, about 10 o'clock last Friday night and it has been, practically, continuously pumped ever since, and it is proving to be a better well than the one on the Lindsey place. The longer it is pumped, so far, the better it gets. Saturday it pumped about 1100 gallons per minute, and Tuesday they were pumping 1280 gallons per minute. With this steady pumping they never were able to lower the water more than eleven feet below the water level, or the bottom of the pit. At last report they shut down the pump to remodel the pulleys and machinery to get more speed to see how much more water they could pump.

J. T. Elliott, the owner of the farm, is utilizing all the water being pumped by using it for irrigating his orchard and fields. This is a well improved place, being formerly owned by J. T. Green and has about 500 growing trees. There is about ten acres

in orchard, in which the trees are five or six years old and, Tuesday evening when the editor of this paper was out there he was giving the soil in this orchard a good soaking. There was sufficient water to flood the ground between two rows of trees at once, besides a large amount of water running over into an alfalfa field. He has Bermuda grass around the house, and this had been thoroughly irrigated. The only complaint was from Mrs. Elliott, who had just put down a couple new carpets and got mud tracks on them. The pump will probably remain at this well all this week and may be longer. Many interested people from Portales and other points have been out to see the stream of water flowing full tilt across the prairie.

The drill completed the Wise well this week and moved to the Baker place. The Wise well is 108 feet deep and is a full fourteen inch hole all the way down.

T. S. O. McDowell of Fairbury, Illinois was here last week and bought 6000 acres of land from the Blue Rapids New Mexico Land Co. being part of what is known as the railroad strip. He bought a block from Seth Morrison in the Morrison addition to Portales. He was here in a private car, being accompanied by his wife, daughter, son, and two brothers. Mr. McDowell is a man of high financial standing and was much pleased with the looks of this country.

That Job as Governor.

It has been reported from Washington that Will Robinson, editor of the Roswell Register-Tribune, has been tendered the appointment as governor. Will Robinson is capable, deserving and worthy and there is nothing too good to bestow upon Robinson. He is a good newspaper man and would make a good governor.

But while discussion is going around as to who will be appointed as the next governor of this territory, it would be well for New Mexico to sit up and take notice that Portales has a man highly qualified and a fit person from all standpoints for this position in the person of Judge Washington E. Lindsey. Judge Lindsey was among the early settlers in Portales Valley and is a man who has kept in very close touch with territorial affairs in his over nine years residence in this land of sunshine. He has served as United States commissioner since in July, 1900, at Portales and in this office he has done business for a world of people all of whom testify to his thoroughness and accuracy and freely given advice.

Judge Lindsey's life and work has given him wide experience. He was born on a farm, fished in the creek and drove the cows barefooted when the frost was on the ground. He graduated from the University of Michigan law school and practiced law in Chicago eight years before coming to New Mexico.

As an advocate of the principles of the republican party there is a no more staunch supporter in New Mexico. He is always looking out for the interest of his party and always devising ways and means to improve his town and community for the good of the people and the territory.

Judge Lindsey is a man of the highest integrity and fairness in all matters. He is a man of broad mind and splendid intellectual attainments and is perfectly capable of filling the office of governor with credit to himself and the territory. In the opinion of the Times no man could be found who could fill this office with greater satisfaction to the people of this territory than Washington E. Lindsey.

However, as a matter of fact, Judge Lindsey is not aspiring for this office and is making no effort to secure it. He is content to follow his present avocation, stay at Portales, and continue to boost for the town and country for the present.

Without Foundation and Fact.

Mr. O. E. Meinzer, who was here during the summer as agent of the government department of geological survey, investigating as to what additional lands should be included in those designated for 320 acre filings, has made a report on our available water supply for irrigation. This report was sent out last week and was published in a few of the territorial papers. While we realize it is the policy of a man in Mr. Meinzer's position to make conservative statements, yet it looks like he went out of his way to make as poor a showing of our apparent water supply for irrigation as possible. When he was here

our plan of irrigating had not been arranged and no test wells had been put down.

Mr. Fuller, an agent of the government reclamation service, who was here since Mr. Meinzer was, and made an investigation especially as to our available water supply, told us quite a different story. Mr. Fuller thoroughly tested the Humble well and said for an eight inch hole this would supply more water than a well of like size at Garden City or any of the best irrigated districts by pumping in the United States. A late letter from department received by Mr. Molinari, states that we can again secure Mr. Fuller's services at any time he is available, and gives his post office address as Phoenix, Arizona, which gives conclusive proof that he is an agent of the reclamation service.

In 1904 a well was drilled in the court house yard at Portales which at a depth of 280 feet flowed water above the surface sufficient to water all the cows in town. This is sufficient evidence to show that these stratus of water are fed by some fountain head other than what percolates from the surface from rainfall. The gravel found in these test wells are round pebbles such as are found in the bed of streams and everything goes to indicate that through the Valley once ran a river and the Valley was partially filled up the underground stream of the river still flows.

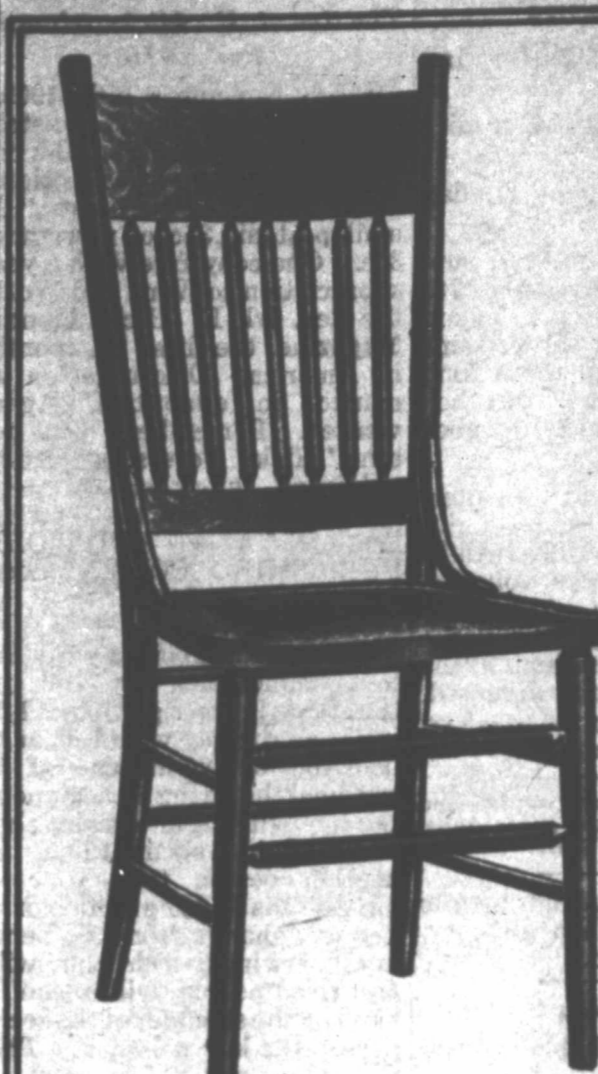

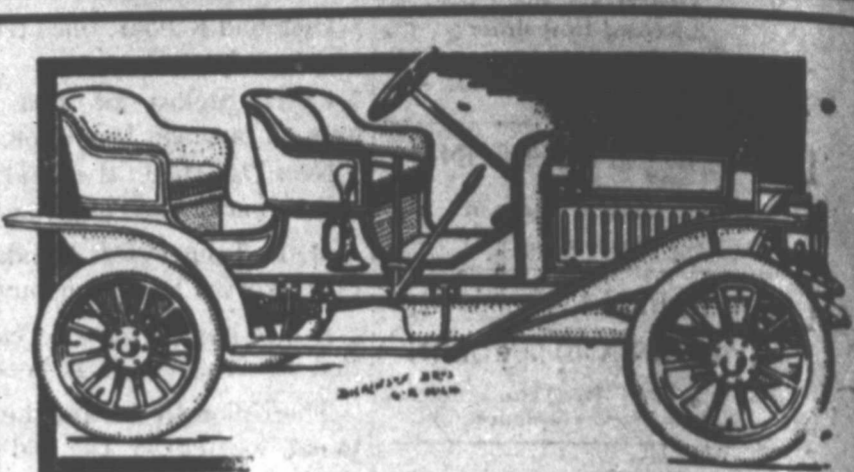
