Successful Broom Corn Raising The Clovis Journal makes the Baker, a farmer living near Baker, post office, northwest of Clovis, last spring planted thirty acres to Evergreen dwarf broom corn and made seven tons on this dred dollars for the crop, which shows pretty good for a dry year Mr. Baker states that he simply followed scientific farming methods, never cultivating deep and using always a light shallow harrow that could be pulled by one horse and that could go between the rows. He said that he keeps constantly harrowing while the crop is growing, only when too wet, just after a rain. In this way he was able to create a mulch near the surface, where it
is very dry, but yet he could in this way preserve the moisture that lay beneath this powdered earth at the top. He beieves in
and practices deep plowing, when the land is first broke, and fol lows the harrow each half day, covering what has been plowed the half day before. Mr. Baker advises that you plant north and south and not too early.
