#### Begins to Look Like Sure Enough Intervention

The raids of the Mexican guerrillo into the United States begins to look something like sure enough intervention. It is true that Carranza, realizing the futility of resistance, has given a grudging consent to the American forces to participate in the capture of Villa, but to the the Democratic Primary. most casual observer, this assent was anything but gracefully given. On the contrary, Carranza, well knowing that this government would go just as cheerfully without his consent as with it, made the best of an unpleasant necessity, and come across with the useless permission. It is hardly conceivable, however, that the soldiers of the United States will long ride with the Mexican constabulary without coming to an open rupture, which ean mean nothing more than taking of the whole situation over by the government on this side of the Rio Grande. This whole situation has been the result of a deliberate intention on the part of Villa to force the power at Washington to intervene in the affairs of Mexico, thus overthrowing the Carranza government. Villa is nothing if not vindictive, and when Washington recognized the de facto government of Carranza it, virtually, made it impossible for Carranza to ever realize his hopes of being the father of his country. If Villa, himself, could not reign or hold in his own hand the destiny of the man who should, then no other should. He would much rather that every man, woman and child in Mexico should be put to the sword than that Carranza should live to triumph over him, hence, failing to get that recognition at Washington which he desired, he determined to make himself and followers so distasteful to Americans that only through intervention could his outrages be curbed and himself eliminated. He well knew the hatred of the Mexicans for the gringos and it is easy for him to forecast the impossible conditions with which an American army would be confronted in that country. He also, probably, believed that Carranza would resort to force before the Americans were allowed to enter his territory. In the latter belief, Carranza proved more wiley than he was given credit for being, but that the two armies may for any length of time work harmoniously together requires too violent a darft on the imagination and the break cannot be long in coming. It is also conceded that the capture of Villa will not be encompassed in a day or a week. He is a wily rascal and knows every nook and cranny in the country where he is operating, whereas the Americans will have to depend upon the enemy race for their information and misinformation, and will, more than likely, get more of the latter than of the former. Trouble in Mexico may well be said to have just now commenced and will be finished only with the complete subjugation of that people. Villa has accomplished his object, he has forced the intervention of the American government and has now only to look out and try to save his own rascally hide.

The State Record appears to be much worried because of the chagrin endured by the American officers by reason of the attitude of President Wilson. Well. it is much better that this bunch of army officers suffer a little in their pride than that the whole nation suffer over its dead. It is possible, also, that President Wilson will be able to live down the displeasure of the State Record.

It is hoped that the meeting that was held for the purpose of devising ways and means to oil the streets of Portales will not have been in vain. It may require heroic measures but the end will justify the means. Don't let this matter drop.

So far the candidates for the office of district attorney have given the newspapers the once over. This may be their idea of economy but it is mighty poor politics.

The Republicans need not worry much over their gubernatorial candidate. The Democrats will furnish the encumbent of that office and it may happen that there will be no change at all in the job. Governor McDonald has proved highly satisfactory to a great majority of the voters of the sunshine state.
