#### Awalt Case Reversed.

The state supreme court today reversed the district court for Curry county in the celebrated case of the state vs. A. L. Awalt, former county clerk, with orders to quash the accusation under which Awalt had been removed from office.

The accusations was presented by the distrct attorney on July 31, 1914, charging Awalt with failure and refusal in his official capacity to account for public moneys coming into his hands. A demurrer by the defendant was in part sustained with leave grauted to the state to amend certain parts. The case was tried by a jury which returned a verdict of guilty and a judgement of removal from office was rendered. The cause was tried before Judge G. A. 




