## Your Hand Has Been Called

For some two or three weeks past the Republican press and the Republican spellbinders have been crying challenge after challenge to the Democratic organs to print the record. As a general proposition, the Democratic

New Mexican is well able to pay any and all of its liabilities, as a matter of fact, it has often been flaunted at that paper that its wealth gave it an unfair advantage over its adversaries, however, in this case that should prove an advantage. Ir thousand dollars is good and the equal of a government bond, just as soon as the service is performed. There are none so simple minded as to believe that the Optic, or any
other Republican newspaper in the state of New Mexico, will even attempt in the most feeble manner, to print the record as it is, ungarbled and without distortion. The Optic has no hankering for this piece of easy money, neither stop thief comes with a peculiar nausea from those who have for the past many years, and before the present executive put a curb on them, systematically looted the state and many of the counties thereof. It is a sad commentary

Have they any reason to believe that the people have forgotten that a large sum of money was paid into the account of the peniten tiary and that before any demand was made for it? Have they any reason to believe that Frank A. Hubbell will be any the less an undesirable senator than he was a super
intendent of schools of Bernalillo county? If he proved recreant to that trust, what right have they to expect that he will not again be a disappointment and his recall be-
come a necessity? The Republicans have taken hold of something that they cannot hold on to, neither can they let loose of it. They are in desperate straits and are grabbing at straws. The record they are demanding will eter nally damn them in the eyes of all honest and decent peo hoping against hope that no one will come out in the open and give this record, unsavory and humiliating as it is Their only hope lies in the fact that to publish this record in all its naked ugliness, cannot help but cast a smirch upon the honor and integrity of the state that all good people are anxious to avert and would gladly forget if the causes of that dishonor would be content to let their own of the world outside the state.
