## Chamber of Commerce Directors to Be Elected by Mail Ballot this Year

The Castro County Chamber of Commerce will hold its annual membership meeting Monday night, December 14 at 7:30 o'clock in the community room of the Court House.

The meeting will be open to the general public and will outline the future plans of the Chamber of Commerce as well as recount the accomplishments of the past year.

In charge of the program will be Chamber of Commerce president Steve Taylor.

This year for the first time, directors will be elected by a mailed ballot. All members are receiving this week a copy of the ballot for two directors. At the first meeting of the new directors on the first Friday morning in January, a new president and vice-president will be elected by the board. These two new officers will be installed at the general membership banquet early next year.

A letter is being mailed this week to members notifying them of the meeting. There will be a ballot enclosed for voting on the new directors.

Nominees named by the nominating committee are James Wohlge-

muth, W.D. Boston, Gene Seely, Bob Cranford, Aaron Isaacs, Paul Hilburn, Claude Faubus, Woodrow Killingsworth, Stanley Schaeffer, and Sandy Parsons, Jr. Also on the ballot will be a place for writing in votes for persons other than the nominees.

The ballots should be marked and mailed back to the Chamber of Commerce office so they can be tabulated not later than Monday. Voting will be by the mail ballot only. Reason for using the unique mail ballot system is to encourage more general membership participation in the selection of Chamber of Commerce officers.

Directors whose terms expire this year are A. V. Barnes, Elton Singer, and Bill Harman. James Wohlge-muth was appointed to fill the unexpired term of Glen Youts who resigned recently. Directors serve three year terms. There are twelve directors and four are elected every year.

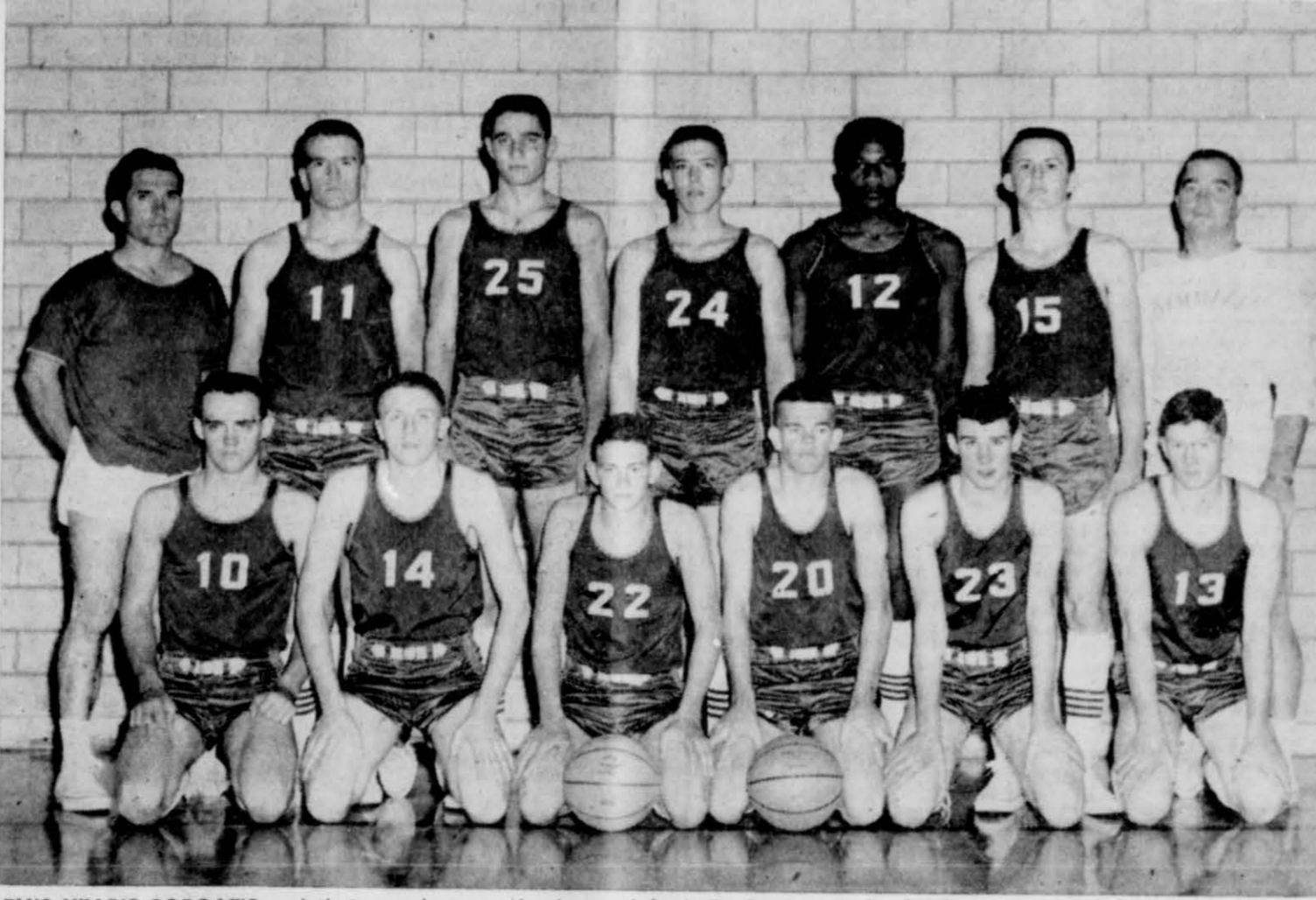

## Freezing Rain Hampers County

Winter landed in Castro County this week spreading a blanket of ice Wednesday night that hampered traffic and caused many falls and general confusion.

The ice was so bad Thursday morning that some cars could not cross roads with high curbs. However, by midmorning the situation had improved somewhat and the snail-pace traffic was back to the normal zip-zip style.

Temperatures Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday ranged from a low of about 22 degrees in the early morning hours to highs of about 34 as skies continued overcast and wind averaged about 12 miles per hour. Precipitation on Thursday was about .17 of an inch.

## Bobcats and Bobbies Win First Basketball Tournaments

The Dimmitt Bobcats and Bobbies continued their winning ways last week, capping it by winning a tournament each.

The Bobcats came home with the Plainview tournament trophy after working their way to the championship by defeating Dumas 61-54 and Levelland 65-47. The Dimmitt team made it a perfect series by dropping Plainview in their own tournament, 49-39. The Bobcats, representing one of the smallest schools entered, had the

tournament's high point man, Junior Coffey. Coffey, also a football star, rounded up 74 points in the three games for the Bobcats.

Coach Bill Culpepper's Bobbies had a rousingly successful weekend also, in taking the Kress tournament. They stopped Vega 68 to 46 and Kress 75 to 66 to gain the Saturday night finals. In a hair-raising finale the Bobbies squeaked by the hard-working Tulla girls, 53-52. The Bobbies trailed 20-26 at the half.

Hart won the consolation prize at the tournament. In Monday night's action at Muleshoe, the Bobcats dropped the Mules 55-36. Junior Coffey was high point man with 18 points. The Bobbies played Muleshoe the same night, but were defeated 51-39. Dora McDermitt was high for Dimmitt with 20 points, followed by Sharon Maynard with 16 and Kay Carpenter with 15.

The Bobcats failed to maintain their winning streak this week, however, as Coach John Ethridge's charges were toppled by Parger 66-35 Tuesday for Dimmitt's first defeat of the season. The game was played at Borger.

## Cotton Referendum Voting By Communities Tuesday

Castro County cotton farmers will have a chance to exercise a certain amount of authority in the way their farm program is handled Tuesday when the annual cotton referendum is held.

In effect, cotton farmers in this county and over the nation will be voting on whether or not they want price supports at 70 or 90 percent of parity with marketing quotas and acreage allotments or 50 percent of parity with no marketing quota penalties, but still with acreage allotments.

Also on the cotton scene, it was reported this week by the ASC office that Castro County farmers would be given an 11.3 increase over their 1960 acreage allotment for 1961. This brings the county's allotment to 58,558 acres. The allotment notices have already been mailed.

Polling places in the Dec. 13 referendum are as follows: Arney

celebrity votes at Harmon-Toles elevator; Hart votes at the Farmers State Bank; Eastie, and Frio vote at Easter gin; Nazareth votes at Nazareth Gin and Grain; Flagg and Big Square communities vote at Flagg Gin; Sunnyside votes at Morrison Gin; and Dimmitt area farmers vote at the ASC office in Dimmitt.

Only one allotment price support program will be available to growers for their 1961 cotton crop. Legislation provided the Choice A and B program, only for 1959 and 1960. They will not be continued again next year.

If marketing quotas are approved in the Dec. 13 referendum, price support will be available to growers who comply with their farm allotments at a level within the range of 70 to 90 percent of parity. As in other years, the exact level of price support will be determined later. Growers who exceed their farm acreage allotments will be subject to penalties of 50 percent of the June 15, 1961 parity price on the farm's excess production of the crop. In addition, none of the cotton produced on the farm will be eligible for price support.

## Christmas Decorating Contest Planned Here

Dimmitt's annual Christmas Decorating Contest will be sponsored this year by Castro County Chamber of Commerce and the Business and Professional Women's Club.

The contest will select winners in three divisions, i.e., window, door and yard scene.

Prizes totaling \$48 will be awarded. Each of the three divisions will have an \$8 first prize, \$3 second prize and \$3 third prize. The contest will not be connected with General Electric national contest.

Deadline for entering is Dec. 17. Anyone may enter their home in the contest simply by calling or dropping by the Chamber of Commerce office. Their telephone number is MI 7-3133. Judging will come between December 18 and 24 by a panel of judges yet to be selected. Judging will be between the hours of 6:30 to 11 p.m. so

lights should be left on during those hours, on those dates. Prizes to the winners will be mailed after judging is completed.

Any residence or business establishment in Dimmitt may be entered in the contest.

Window and door decorations will be judged solely on their own merits and any supporting yard decorations will not be considered. Door decorations may be around the outside of the door of the home or business or in a door window. Any yard scene, door or window decoration may have either a religious, lighting, or Santa Claus basis.

There is no entry fee.

## Medical Auxiliary Launches 4th 'Operation Christmas Greeting'

Members of the Tierra Blanca Medical Society Auxiliary this week began preparations for the fourth annual "Operation Christmas Greeting" to be carried out in Castro County.

The women, all wives of doctors who practice within the county, use the unique drive to supply needed equipment to the Castro County Hospital.

"Operation Christmas Greeting" is supported by people who deposit the amount they normally spend on Christmas cards at the bank in a special account. Just before Christmas a large Christmas greeting advertisement, bearing everyone's name who participated, is printed in the Castro County News without charge. More than \$600 was collected in this manner last year.

The auxiliary says this not only helps obtain a better-equipped local hospital, but it also takes the work out of buying, addressing, and mailing Christmas cards. There is also the added advantage that no one is overlooked, they say.

No particular piece or type of equipment for the hospital has yet been selected, according to Mrs. Carl Page. In past years a croupe tent for babies, an oxygen tent, incubator, and operating room overhead light have been supplied through this method. It has also helped buy a diathermy machine. Usually about a thousand dollars is collected through this method from several hundred people.

Anyone wishing to participate may do so by depositing an amount to the Operation Christmas Greeting fund in the First State Bank at Dimmitt or Farmers State Bank at Hart.

**Wheat May Have Paper Potential**  
USDA scientists have discovered a possible new use for wheat. In laboratory tests, acid modified wheat flour has proved equal to commercial sizing material for imparting strength to paper.

Some papers sized with modified flour gained 43 percent in bursting strength, 20 percent in tensile strength and 93 percent in folding endurance. Papers treated with modified flour size were comparable to papers treated with widely used commercial size, in brightness, opacity, freedom from discoloration and other desirable properties.

Successful chemical modification of wheat flour by reacting it with ethylene or propylene oxide was first reported by ARS in June of 1949. It was found that these chemically modified flours mix easily with water to form a free-flowing paste a quality desirable in industrial paper making. U.S.D.A. chemists also reported that chemically modified flour could be stored with a moisture content of 5 percent or less.

On the basis of recent performance tests with laboratory scale equipment, it is expected that at least one of the acid modified flours will perform satisfactorily in high-speed paper making machines, according to workers at the ARS's Northern Utilization Research and Development Division.

### Seedlings for Windbreaks are Again Available

Plenty of seedlings are available for Texas who want to reforest or plant windbreaks this winter. Reports Bill Smith, extension forester. Orders are being taken now by the Texas Forest Service, College Station.

"Requests for trees will be handled on a first-come-first-served basis, so interested persons are urged to submit their applications and payments right away," Smith explains.

Application forms for reforestation trees are available from Pineywoods county agents. Soil Conservation Districts, ASC officers or district offices of the Texas Forest Service. The windbreak tree forms are available from some of the offices of West Texas County agents. Either of the forms may be obtained by writing, Texas Forest Service, College Station, Texas.

Shipment of reforestation seedlings will start about December 15, Smith continues.

Slash, shortleaf and loblolly pines are available at either East Texas nursery, and a limited supply of loblolly pine grown from seed collected in Bastrop and Fayette counties, will be available from the Indian Mound Nursery in Cherokee county. No order for less than 500 of the reforestation seedlings will be accepted.

Also, some 13 different kinds of hardwood and evergreen seedlings plus multistoried rose plants will be available for farmstead, field or field windbreak plantings. These trees will be shipped between January 15 and March 15, 1961.

"These trees will not be available for shade or ornamental plantings," Smith said.

## "Vegetables Not Exactly Gamble"

When the statement "Growing vegetables is a gamble," is made could this be a case of the culprit blaming the victim? Is the busi-

ness itself a gamble, or are the farmers actually the gamblers? Clyde Singletary, extension horticulturist, says that the only way to learn the answers to these questions is to take a look at the vegetable business.

With few exceptions, most vegetables are staple food items of most American families. Per capita consumption of most vegetables is increasing each year along with rapid growth in our population. Vegetable surpluses are temporary — in many cases lasting only a few days or weeks. These surplus problems can, however, be damaging to growers.

The vegetable industry, particularly as it relates to consumption, appears quite stable, continues Singletary. Week-to-week price fluctuations occur, but averages over a period of years are fairly stable.

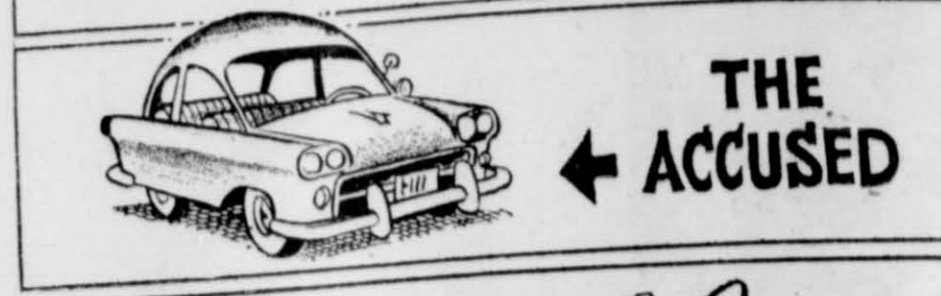
If consumption is always positive, why should this be the attitude that growing vegetables is such a gamble. Could it be that some farmers are blaming the industry when they should be blaming faulty production practices?

Singletary says that yield per acre, quality yield, speculative growing, concern for product after harvesting and knowledge of competition are the main factors in determining profit or loss. Careful analysis of the vegetable situation in Texas reveals that low yields per acre is the most important factor affecting the income of growers. Consumers are quality conscious, thus quality is one of the most important tools of bargaining.

Speculative growing is another income reducer. Planting without planning can lead to disaster. Another common fault of some vegetable producers is the apparent desire to drop all responsibility for their products as soon as they leave the field. Growers need to be as concerned about the product from the field to the consumer as from seed to harvest, says the specialist.

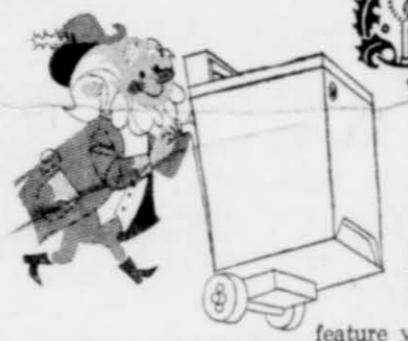
Singletary concludes by saying that producers need to know their markets. That is, they must know how much of what will be needed at a certain place at a certain time.

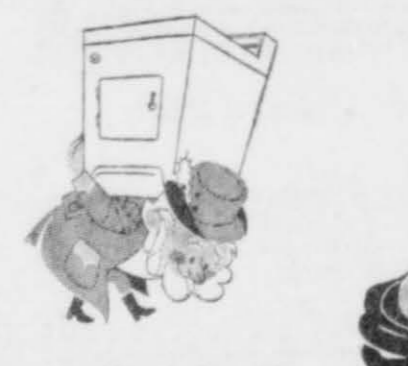

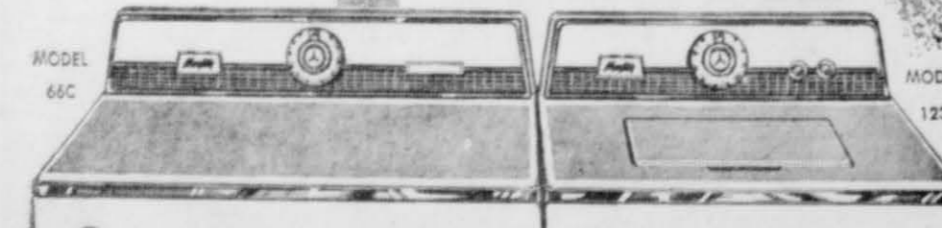
