## CONGRESS WILL MEET AND DECLARE WAR

Congress will be convened in extraordinary session on the second day of April to perform the duty that rightfully devolved upon the congress recently adjourned; the duty that would have been performed had it not been for the refusal of twelve members of the senate, who refused to give authority to the president to take what measures appeared necessary to protect the lives of American citizens upon the open seas. It is a foregone conclusion that the incoming congress will issue a declaration of war against Germany and her allies. It is also very probable that a similar declaration will be promulgated by Germany against the United States before that date. This government has been very patient with the warring nations and it is more than likely that this patience has been mistaken for timidity. This would be an error followed by a rude awakening. While the administration has been slow to anger it is nevertheless true that, when once thoroughly aroused it may be depended upon to give such an account of itself as will prove the metal of the boldest enemy. In the mean time, hurry up orders have been issued for the building
and arming of many floating war machines and, with the and arming of many floating war machines and, with the almost unlimited resources of this nation, it is safe to pre-
sume that, by the time any other nation can reach our shores with an army sufficiently large to prove a serious menace, it will find us thoroughly prepared to meet This is a time when personal opinions and predilections for any favorite among the nations now involved must be laid
aside. We are all Americans and we must all combine to meet any and all American foes regardless of their tionality. President Wilson will have a united people be hind him in whatever course he may decide to pursue.

It will be remembered that during the recent campaign, and while things political were waxing rather warm and in the pay of the Republican organization, came to Portales, made speeches and attempted to organize Republican clubs among the ladies of Roosevelt county. She represented to them that their only hope of securing the ballot lay in the Republican party; that the Democrats were violently opposed to lady politicians and voting wo-
men. She held meetings and appointed committees for the purpose of proselyting but, for some reason, the ladies of Portales were not over confident that the Republicans were enthusiastic supporters of the proposed suffrage amendment, and the future doingo of that party fully justified their skepticism. The last legislature was Republican, strongly so, and the senate was presided over by Republican lieutenant-governor, and he, later, through the
death of the governor, became the chief executive. Did this Republican legislature give the ballot to the ladies? Well, not yet. They juggled with it to some extent, but
at no time was it in any danger of having to go before the people for ratification or rejection This cannot be laid at the door of the Democrats. Even had they opposed it, which they did not, they could not have prevented it from being submitted to a vote.
