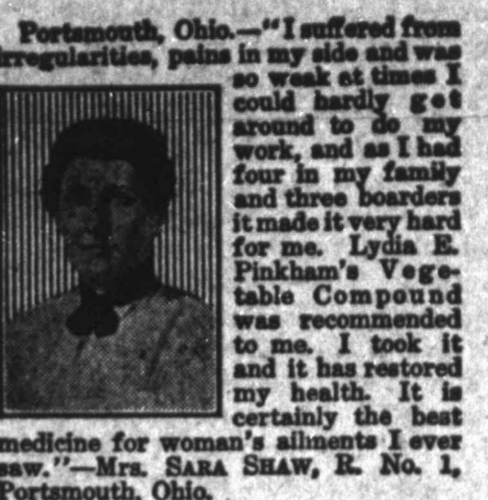

Notice To Taxpayers!

Notice is hereby given to the taxpayers of Roosevelt County, New Mexico, that the tax assessor or a deputy will visit the precincts of the county at the time and place designated below, for the purpose of making the assessments of all taxable property for the year 1919. (Listing all property that you own on the first day of January.) Bring your deeds that we may get your numbers correct.

ASSESSOR'S NOTICE TO THE PUBLIC

The laws of the State of New Mexico require that every inhabitant of the state, of full age and sound mind, shall, in each year make a list of all property subject to taxation of which he is the owner or has the control or management. Such list must be on the form prescribed by law by the State Tax Commission and must be made and filed in the office of the County Assessor on or after the first day of January and not later than the last business day of February of each year.

In compliance with law and for the convenience of taxpayers I will be at the various places in Roosevelt County on the respective dates as follows, for the purpose of taking lists of property:

Table with 2 columns: Precinct No., Name and Location, Date. Lists various precincts and their assessment dates.

Any person failing to meet me at these appointments may make return to my office in Portales at any time within the limits fixed by law as given above, or blank for making rendition will be sent upon application, by mail or in person, to my office.

A penalty of twenty-five per cent in addition to the regular valuation, must be added to the value of all property not listed for assessment within the time and in the form prescribed by law. No exceptions can be made to this law.

FIFTEEN YEARS AGO

From the Portales Times of January 16, 1904: M. Newman was slated to go from the M. T. Jones lumber yard here to the one at Brownwood, Texas, and G. W. Carr of Canyon was to take charge of the yard here. The birth of a boy at the W. E. Lindsey home was announced. W. E. Brown, a cattle man, and Miss Fannie Minns, were married January 14 by Rev. Messer at the Chas Woodcock home. Lafayette Hardy secured the contract to carry the mails twice a week between Mexline and Portales for \$500 a year. Will Kilpatrick and Miss Rilla Johnson were to be married at Elida. Contract was let for a telephone line from Portales to Floyd, via Bethel. The Woodmen unveiled a monument with ceremony at the cemetery, erected over the grave of F. F. Tuck. The jail was moved from the center of the public square in readiness for the building of the new court house.

TEN YEARS AGO

From the Portales Times of January 14, 1909: Joe Howard went on a business trip to Waterloo, Iowa. Eagle Henderson, printer for the Hereford Brand, came in for a visit with homefolks. Coe Howard went to Lebanon, Tennessee, to take a course in law school. J. H. Sandefer accompanied his son Zeffie to Clarendon, Tex., where the latter entered college. Attorney G. L. Reese went to Melrose to act as counsel for Arthur Adams charged with the murder of Guy H. Porter. At the session of the supreme court held at Santa Fe, Q. A. Kaune, J. C. Compton and C. M. Compton Jr., all of Portales, were admitted to the bar and given the right to practice as attorneys at law. In the justice election, A. B. Seay was elected without opposition, and Charles Duncan was elected constable in this district. Mrs. Martha S. Kimbrough died December 19 at the home of her father, Jesse Morrison, near Bethel, aged about forty-two years.
