If You Are "Nuts" See Dentist
Trenton, N. J., Nov. 6.—The report of Dr. Henry A. Cotton, medical director of the Trenton State Hospital, is said to show that two patients have been cured of insanity by pulling their teeth. One was a woman, who was discharged from the hospital as cured in December, 1919, but developed hallucinations a month ago and was returned to the hospital. An extensive examination of the mouth showed that 27 teeth were infected. These were removed and the woman's condition improved so much she is now considered normal.

Another woman, who had been discharged in July, 1919, after being three years in the hospital, suffered a breakdown recently and was brought back. It was found she had neglected her teeth, and the infected teeth were pulled, with the result that her mental condition has returned to normal.

Dr. Cotton says that the hospital broke all its records for discharges in the past month, sending home 62 patients practically recovered from their mental disorders. He thinks this due chiefly to modern methods of attack against the infection.

TEXAS STATE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION WILL AID U. S. SAVINGS CAMPAIGN

Austin, Texas—Cooperation between the State Department of Education of Texas and the Savings Division of the United States Treasury Department for the Eleventh Federal Reserve District for the coming year has been placed on a definite basis. Miss Annie Webb Blanton, State Superintendent, approved the program proposed for the school by the Savings Division, assigning a Supervisor to prepare material the Savings Division will furnish teachers.

Representatives of the State Department of Education have presented the Division's school plans to institutes in which teachers of about one hundred counties were assembled during the first week of September. S. M. N. Marrs, Chief Supervisor of High Schools, read the program to teachers of fourteen counties in joint institutes at Canyon; Assistant Superintendent E. L. Dohoney, explained the plan at Victoria, Huntsville and Beaumont and other institutes visited. L. D. Borden, Chief Supervisor of Rural Schools, included it in his speeches at Beeville, Woodville, Orange and other institutes. W. E. James, Rural School Supervisor presented the matter to institutes at Waxahachie, Hillsboro, Marshall and other cities.

"Earn, save and invest" said Peyton Irving, Jr., Director's assistant for Education for the Division, "is the slogan. Pupils are taught how to care for their business affairs as well as their language, their morals and their physical welfare. They must know it is a privilege, a blessing as well as a duty, to work. They must come to feel intuitively, that they must live on less than they earn, and put away savings for future needs; otherwise they face dependency or crime. It is the duty of teachers to see these teachings fruit into action. Savings Securities, Thrift Stamps, War Savings Stamps of the government, and savings banks are to be recommended for pupils to use in preserving and increasing their savings."

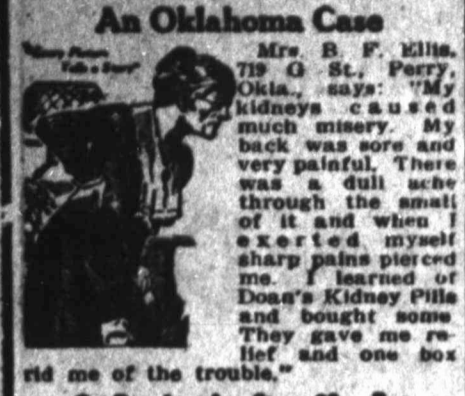

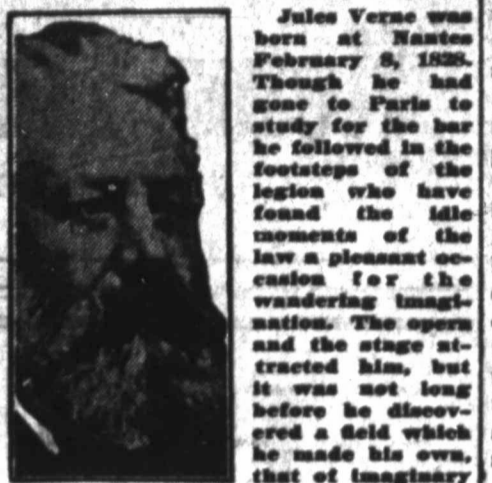

APPROVED UNIFORM INTERNATIONAL SUNDAY SCHOOL LESSON

LESSON FOR NOVEMBER 14 THE POWER AND AUTHORITY OF JESUS. LESSON TEXT—Matt. 9 and 9. GOLDEN TEXT—And Jesus went about all the cities and villages, teaching in their synagogues, and preaching the gospel of the kingdom, and healing every sickness, and every disease among the people.

In chapters 8 and 9 are grouped a number of miracles which exhibit what the King can do over the chief foes of mankind—sickness, sin, satanic power, death, sorrow and storms. It is fitting that they should be grouped here, following the laws of the kingdom, for they show the King's power to administer the affairs of the kingdom, and produce within his subjects the graces of character set forth in these laws.

I. Jesus Heals a Leper (8:1-4). 1. This dreadful disease was the most loathsome and hopeless known. In the Jewish ritual it was regarded as a symbol of sin. It was incurable by man. Only the Divine Physician can cure sin.

II. Jesus Heals the Centurion's Servant (8:5-13). 1. The disease—paralysis. In paralysis the victim is helpless and disqualified for service.

III. Jesus Calms the Sea (8:23-27). 1. The King asleep in the storm-tossed boat (v. 24). Since the King is the Almighty Creator, he had no reason to fear, and therefore, could well be resting in sleep.

IV. Jesus Casts Out Demons (8:28-34). After stilling the tempest Jesus crossed to the other side of the sea into heathen territory.

V. Jesus Healing a Woman With an Issue of Blood (9:20-22). 1. Her helpless condition (v. 20). She had been a great sufferer for twelve long years.
