## MATCHES AND A LOCOMOTIVE

## Are Responslble For The Death Of One Person And The Maiming of Two More

Mrs. C. E. South, wife of a farwer hiviog on the North Clyde Road, about two miles northwest of Baird, was so badly hurned last Wednesday worning that she died that evening it about five o'clock. Interment as made gesterday eveaing in the Clyde Ceraetery, funerai services aving been held at her late home three oclock, conducted by Rev. h. L. Stutz.

On the morning of the fatal acdent Mr. South bad gone to the eld to work, leaving Mrs. Suuth, a ery large woman, who had been in II health for some time, alone in er bedroom, in which there was no ire. The only other occupant of fie house was a boy, who, shortly iter Mr. South's departure, went ut to malk.
At about 8:30 o'elock Mr. South oticed amoke pouring from the windows of his wife's room. He ran to the house and bursting into the room found the bed in flames, half-burned matches scattered about the room and hie wife prone upon the floor anconscions and every vestige of lothing burned from her body except small band about her waist.
He extioguished the flames and at once summoned Dr. R. L. Griggs by telephone. He found the pa. tient apparently suffering no pain but beyond medical akill. She pased into the beyond at about \#ve 'clock that evening.
Mrs. South was the mother of 15 bilidren, 13 of whom are living. he was a sister of the first Mrs. leorge E. Printz, about 65 years of ge and a most exemplary woman. A T. \& P.
