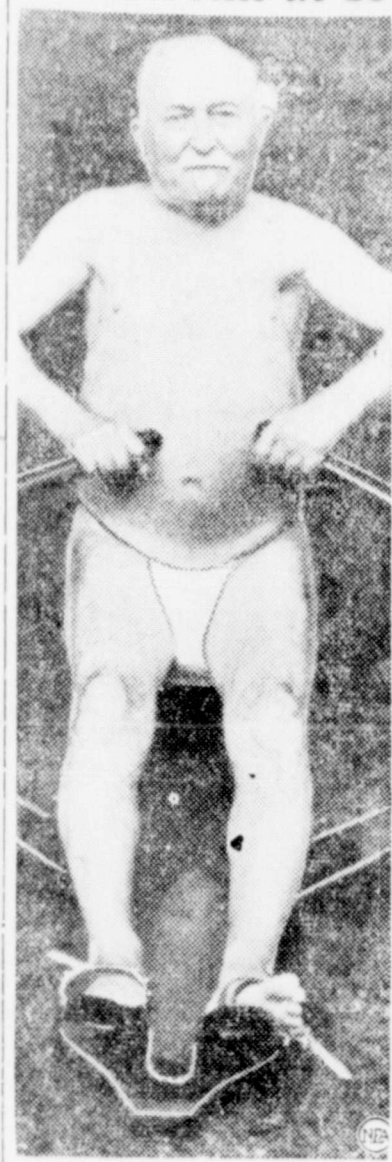

The 1938 range conservation program will be explained to Eastland county ranchers, livestock farmers, and others who are interested Tuesday, March 29. Five cities have been selected as meeting centers for this purpose. They are: Rising Star, Gorman, Ranger, Eastland, and Cisco. The meeting will be held in Cisco at the chamber of commerce at 4:00 p. m. A tour of range improvement demonstrations will be conducted by Eastland county ranchers on Wednesday March 30, in cooperation with the extension service of A. and M. and with the county agricultural council. Anyone interested in these demonstrations can attend. The ranchers and livestock farmers are particularly invited. Tour of the demonstrations will begin at the J. O. Allen ranch house, 10 miles east of Ranger on Highway 1, and 8 miles south on the upper Desdemona road, at 9:00 a. m.; Wednesday, March 30. Three ranches in the Cisco area will be visited for demonstrations, they are: S. H. Hill ranch, five miles northeast of Cisco on the Cisco-Breckenridge highway, at 1:30 p. m.; George P. Fee, two miles northeast of Cisco on the Cisco-Breckenridge highway, at 2:15 p. m.; F. E. Harrell, 2 1/2 miles west of Cisco on Highway No. 1, at 3:15 p. m.

**Two More Deep  
Tests Started for  
Rising Star Area**

RISING STAR, March 25 (Sp.)—Two more deep test locations have been made in the Rising Star territory and work on two more drilling blocks is nearing completion. Whiteside, Lockhart and Harvey, with Marion Harvey as contractor, are moving in on the A. O. Angel place four miles west of Rising Star for a test to the Ranger line and will be drilling soon. W. G. Sawyer and associates were to move in this week on the A. L. McDaniel place, about seven miles southeast of the McCarter & Anderson well on the Smith estate for a deep test and are expected to be drilling by next week. R. C. McCarter reported that everything was about ready to begin running regular tower on the Smith No. 1 and regular drilling will be going forward by the end of the week. The well was spudded late the past week. A big National rig is being used for the work. Haynor, Reeves and Hore are making good progress rigging up on their P. C. Larkin No. 1, three miles northwest of Rising Star, and are expected to be drilling early next week. A big steel rig has been erected and combination rotary and cable tools will be the equipment.

**Texas Power Report  
For February Good**

AUSTIN, March 25 (Sp.)—Electric power consumption in Texas continued during February its favorable trend in comparison with the corresponding month last year, the University of Texas bureau of business research has reported. Fourteen power companies of Texas representing the major portion of the production of the state show an increase in consumption over February last year of 12.6 per cent. The decline from January was only 4.1 per cent compared with the average seasonal drop of nearly 8 per cent. Commercial consumption was up 11.2 per cent from February last year and down 6.6 per cent from January; industrial consumption increased 12.2 per cent over February last year, and was 4.3 per cent below that of January; while residential consumption was 11.6 per cent greater than a year ago and 9.6 per cent less than that of the preceding month.

**Favorable Trend in  
Postal Receipts**

AUSTIN, March 25 (Sp.)—Postal receipts in Texas continued a favorable trend during February in comparison with last year, according to the University of Texas bureau of business research. Reports from 37 representative Texas cities show total receipts of \$1,181,501 during February, an increase of 2.8 per cent over February last year, but a decline of 5.6 per cent from the preceding month. The decline in receipts from January are attributable to the shorter month. Cities in which receipts during February were greater than in both the preceding month and the corresponding month last year were Amarillo, Brownsville, Fort Worth, Galveston, and Sweetwater. Some 50,000 beauty shops in the United States do a business of more than \$100,000,000 yearly and production of American cosmetics is \$200,000,000 each year.

**Building Permits  
Gain in February**

AUSTIN, March 25 (Sp.)—Building permits in Texas during February gained sharply over both the preceding month and corresponding month last year, the University of Texas bureau of business research has announced. Reports from 36 Texas cities representing all sections of the state, show total permits of \$5,805,751, an increase of 28.8 per cent over the preceding month and 26.1 per cent over the like month last year. Cities registering gains over both comparable periods were Austin, Big Spring, Brownwood, Corpus Christi, Corsicana, Denison, El Paso, Galveston, Graham, Houston, Lubbock, McAllen, Palestine, Paris, Plainview, Port Arthur, Sherman, Snyder, Tyler, and Waco.

## Horse Still Has Important Place With Cavalry

FORT SAM HOUSTON, March 25.—The tank, the light-speed tank and the airplane are already being established as the players in the military and military branches of the United States army, but not for some time to come will they replace the horse as the vehicle of the cavalry.

Brig. Gen. Rex Lee, commander of the 1st Cavalry division at Fort Bliss, Tex., expects to prove that point in a series of reorganization tests he will conduct for the war department at Balmorhea, Tex., in April and May.

As in the cavalry branch, the war department has given consideration a reorganization of the cavalry regiment and division to make them speedier and more maneuverable. That can be accomplished possibly by the ad-

dition of wheeled vehicles, but not wholly. The chief problem will be to make the division more compact, its sections less dependent upon one another.

Initial plans for the test indicated that the chief point of encroachment of the motor vehicle into the domain of the horse will be equipment and ammunition.

The first phase of the maneuvers began March 16, when the 12th Cavalry left its stations at Forts Brown and Ringgold, on the Mexican border, for Fort Clark, Tex., where it will consolidate with the 9th Cavalry to form a provisional regiment. The 7th Cavalry will consolidate at Fort Bliss in a similar regiment.

Test April 20. With these regiments consolidated, tests at Fort Clark and Fort Bliss will be conducted until April 20, when the two regiments will consolidate at Balmorhea.

Thus consolidated, the regiment enters the second phase of the

test—splitting into three regiments for the purpose of forming combat teams. Imaginary enemies will be engaged in battle, under conditions as near those of war times as possible, giving a thorough test to the brigade organization.

The third phase, which will end May 16, involves the testing of the reorganized division as a whole.

Importance of the maneuvers is emphasized by the fact that the war department is at the present time studying reports on a similar test of an infantry division, conducted in this area last fall, with a view toward a complete reorganization of the infantry branch of the army into units of approximately 12,000 men each. Following of that test by the cavalry maneuvers would indicate that a reorganization of the entire army might be in the offing.

Chief reasons for a reorganization would be to afford the cavalry an opportunity to take advantage of the improved weapons and machines produced by industry, and to weld the branch into a more maneuverable unit.

### Reorganization Table

The table of reorganization, prepared by the war department, follows in principle that set up for the proposed infantry division. No strengths have yet been prescribed for reorganized infantry elements. Brigades have been eliminated. Three regiments are provided instead of four, and a field artillery, formed by three battalions, is added.

The provisional cavalry regiment to be formed for test purposes contains a headquarters troop, two machine gun troops, three rifle squadrons and attached personnel.

Attached field artillery regiments will be tested under three different organization plans. First, a regiment of two battalions with three batteries to each battalion; second, a three-battalion regiment with two batteries to each battalion; and third, a regiment of four batteries without battalion organizations.

Other organizational changes include a reduction in size of service and supply organizations and an increased use of motor for supply. Regimental train motor vehicles, with the exception of combat train vehicles, will be withdrawn from the cavalry and field artillery units and consolidated with the quartermaster squadron. Approximately 6,000 troops, in-

cluding all of the personnel of the 1st Cavalry division of Fort Brown, Fort Ringgold, Fort Clark and Fort Bliss, and units from Fort D. A. Russell and Fort Sam Houston will participate in the maneuvers.

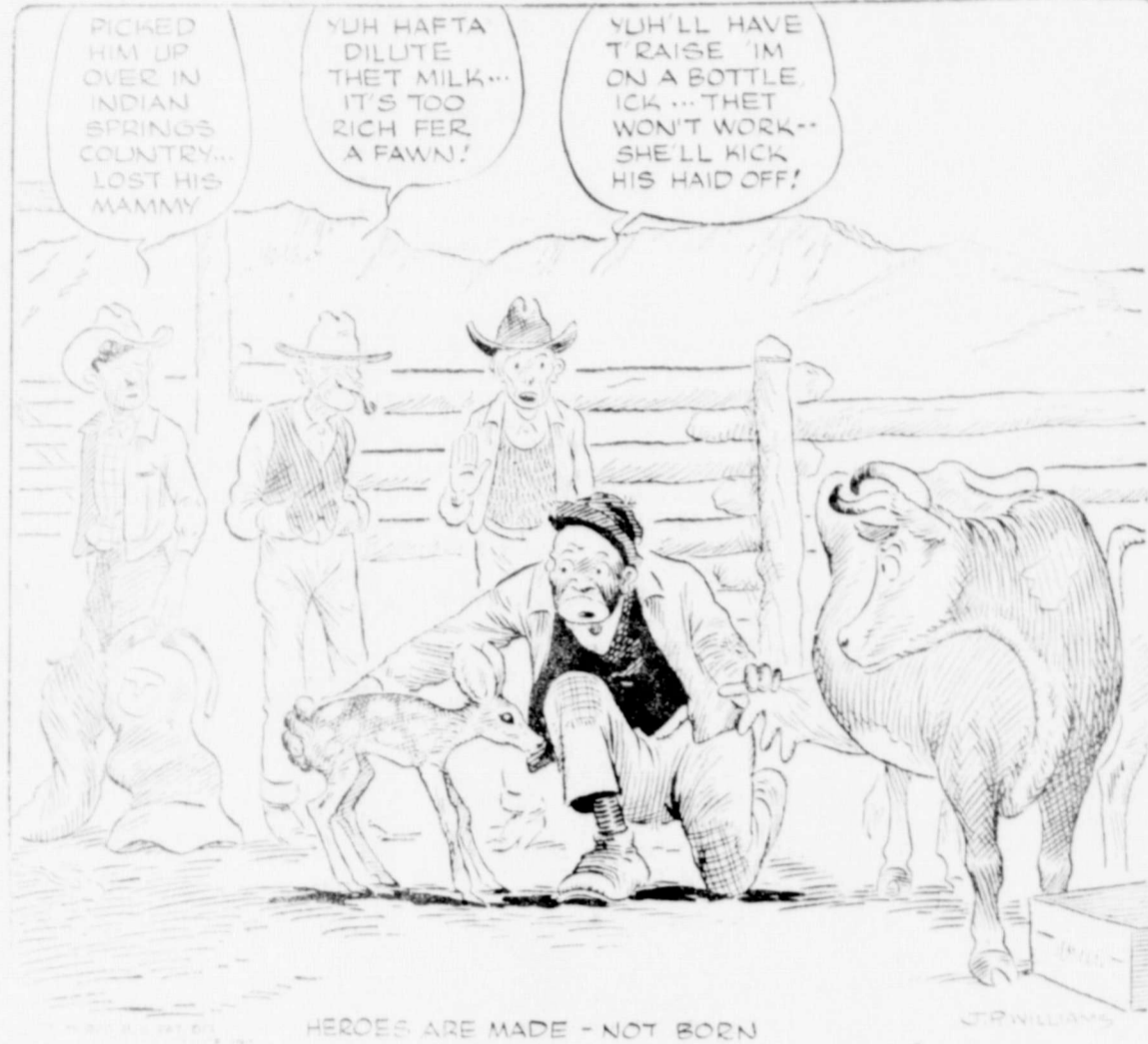

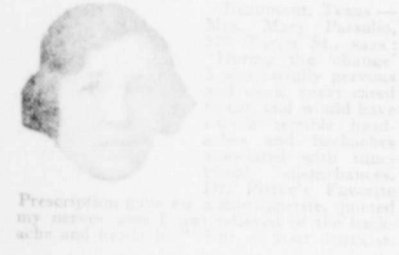

AUSTIN, March 24 (Sp)—Marvin Hall, state fire insurance commissioner, today urged state-wide observance of Clean-Up week as an effective means of fire prevention. The week of April 3-10 has been set aside by Governor James V. Allred for the annual clean-up campaign.

"This will be an excellent opportunity to dispose of unnecessary rubbish, combustible materials, and inflammable goods or solutions which naturally accumulate around the home, store, and factory," Hall said. "These, and other hazards, can be removed or reduced to the direct benefit of all concerned."

Hall explained that the people of Texas had made great progress with their fire prevention activities during the past few years,

and that reduction in insurance cost had been the result.

"We cannot afford to jeopardize this good record," he said. "Clean-Up week will be an appropriate time for us to eliminate any hazards or conditions that might start or spread a fire."

"It is only through such care and diligence that fire prevention can be successful," Hall pointed out. "For this reason I urge every Texas citizen to observe Clean-Up week, and to extend the fire-prevention activities of that week to include every day of the year."

JUDGMENTS IN APPELLATE COURT

Two cases from Taylor county, one from county court and the other from 104th district court, were acted upon Friday by the eleventh court of civil appeals at Eastland.

In the case appealed by D. G. Bowers against C. C. Ground, appealed from county court, the higher court, its opinion written by Associate Justice Clyde Grisom, reversed the judgment of the trial court and rendered judgment that Ground take nothing.

The case had its outgrowth from a loan of \$244.44 by Bowers to Ground. The note was to be paid in 12 monthly installments and was secured by a mortgage on Ground's automobile. It was contended by Ground that after he failed to pay two installments he had a verbal agreement with Bowers that Bowers store the car 10 days; that Ground within 10 days would pay to Bowers the two past due payments and a third installment which would not then be due; that upon such payment Bowers would surrender the car to Ground. Bowers took the car before the expiration of 10 days and sold it. Ground sued Bowers for conversion.

The jury found a verbal agreement had been made; determined the car was worth \$278.25; that Bowers did not take possession of the car and sell it under terms of the chattel mortgage; that in disposing of the car Bowers acted willfully and with malice. Exemplary damages were awarded in the sum of \$112.66. Upon findings of the jury, judgment was rendered for the plaintiff for aggregate of sums, less the amount of plaintiff's debt. Bowers appealed. The higher court said that since the plaintiff had failed to show the facts amounting to a converse, the court in Taylor county should have instructed a verdict for the defendant.

The court also added that the plaintiff failed to have cause for action.

The trial court held the land could be taxed but the Eastland court reversed the decision and rendered judgment for the city.
