Prices Paid to Farmers for Prime Crops Have Sunk Heavily. Cox S

AUSTIN, Feb. 3.—Industrial wages have doubled in the last 25 years, but prices paid farmers for their principal crops—cotton, corn and wheat—have sunk to less than half what they received a quarter of a century ago.

The livestock industries have fared better. Beef cattle prices are 96 per cent of the 1909-14 average; hogs, 80 per cent; butter fat, 71 per cent; wool, 88 per cent; chickens, 93 per cent, and eggs, 75 per cent.

"Judged on the basis of prices the major alternative in agriculture seems to be more livestock,"
