THE grant to the Standard Oil Co. of California of an oil concession covering the whole kingdom of Saudi Arabia is a very significant event.

There is the technical imperialism which is a matter of capital in Country A obtaining economic control of certain resources in Country B.

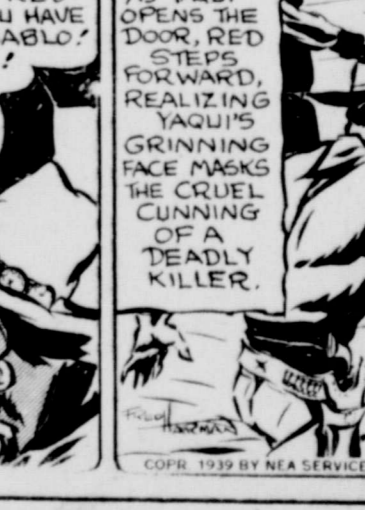
WASHINGTON. — Officially, the United Automobile Workers' strike against General Motors in the Detroit-Cleveland area is not yet before the National Labor Relations Board.

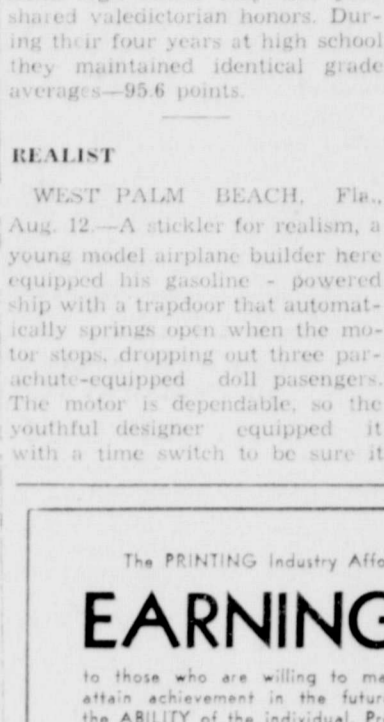

Even Pigeons Get Lost Mile Down

PRESCOTT, Ariz., Aug. 12 (AP)—Carrier pigeons released at the bottom of the mile-deep Grand Canyon failed to find their way back to their home lofts here.
Only one of the five returned to Phantom ranch, from which they were released. Park employees said the birds seemed bewildered after their trip down into the canyon on the back of a mule.
Another effort to fly pigeons out of the canyon will be made next June. Training flights will be made, meanwhile, from the south rim and other nearby points.

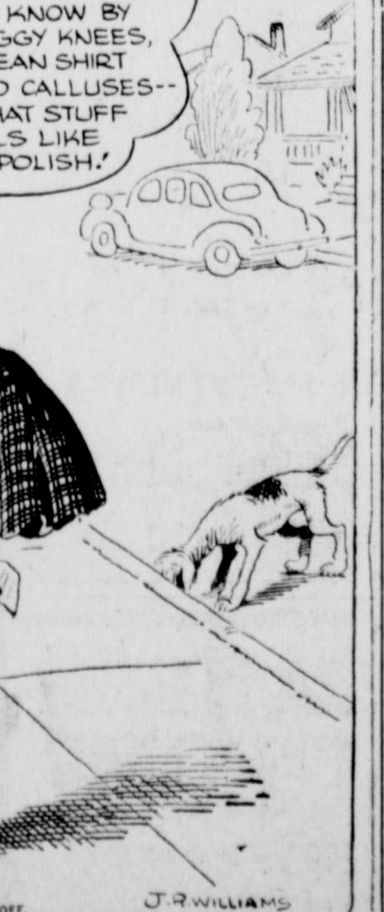

You Got Radium? This Would Tell

WASHINGTON, Aug. 12 (AP)—Development of an improved portable radium detector, sensitive enough to detect the slightest evidence of radio-active material in a living person, is reported by the National Bureau of Sanitation.
It is said the device will help decrease accidental contamination by radioactive materials, a frequent occurrence in research laboratories and commercial plants where the materials are handled.
