

Even this is a violation of our statutes, but be that as it may, I am not complaining about the \$1.00 or who I paid it to. What I want to call your attention to is the condition of your local jail.

I can truthfully say it was one of the hottest jails I have ever been locked up in, notwithstanding the fact that you have ample natural air conditioning.

I have been in lots of jails that furnished better accommodations than your jail and I think your club should take Eome action to better the conditions regarding it, in as much as a majority of your citizenship will have a chance

citizenship of a town as rodeo minded as are the people of Cisco, and I am sure that any town putting forth the united effort your people are to advertise your rodeo will not have to worry about attendance or success of the show.

As a last request, however, I ask that something be done about your jail before I return to Cisco and I am sure that the Lions club will not overlook this opportunity to be of real service to its citizen-


