Finns Withdraw--

Devastating punishment was inflicted on the Russians on the eastern part of the Karelian isthmus, the high command said, when the enemy was concentrating for an attack in this area where the Finns held their original Mannerheim fortifications.

Above Lake Ladoga, the high command announced that Russian attackers ran into a withering fire at Kollanajoki, Ahtajoki and Kollas. In addition to 1,000 Russians killed at the latter point, the Finns said one propeller steamer, one armored car and one tank were put out of action.

While the fierce fighting continued northeast of Lake Ladoga, Finnish salvage forces were hauling to the rear a long line of tanks, trucks, armored cars, field kitchens, wagons and other equipment of the Thirty-Fourth Soviet Tank brigade, powerful fighting units which fell victim to the Finns in their latest major triumph.

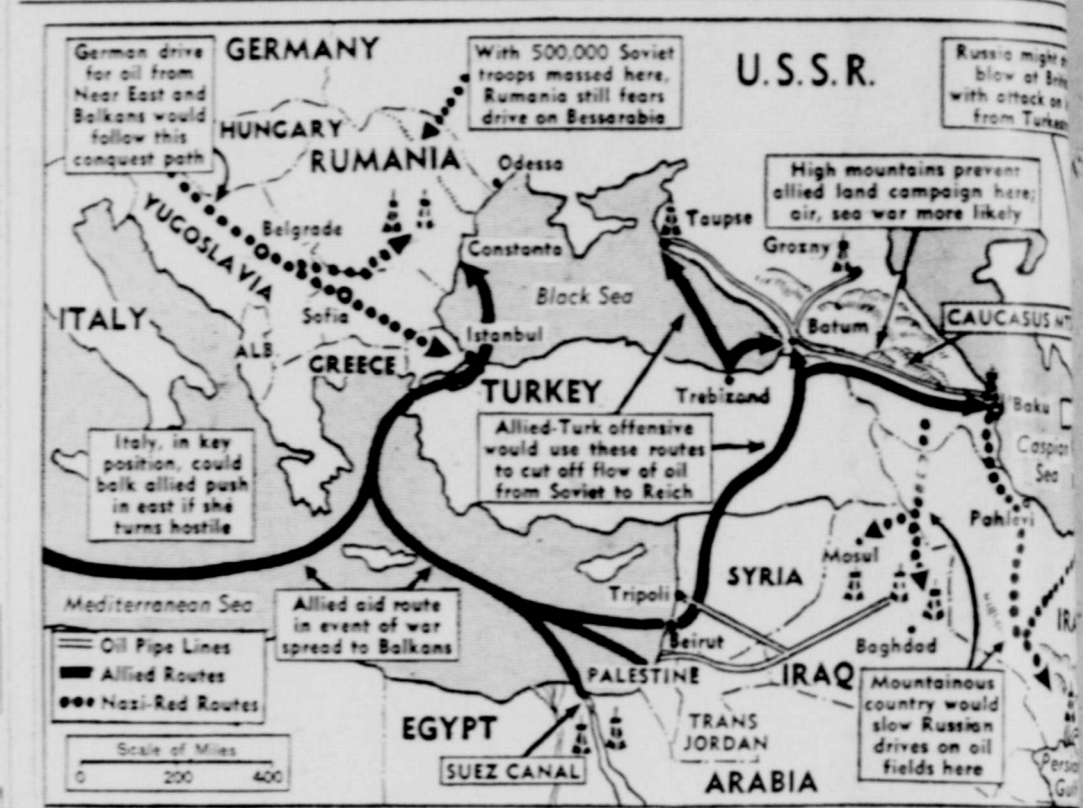

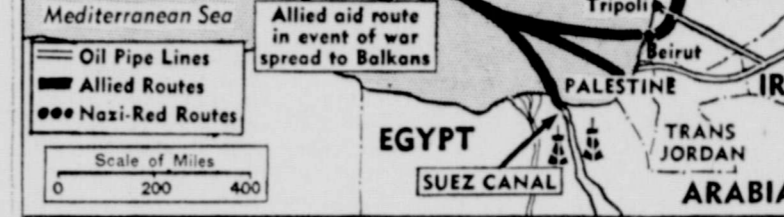

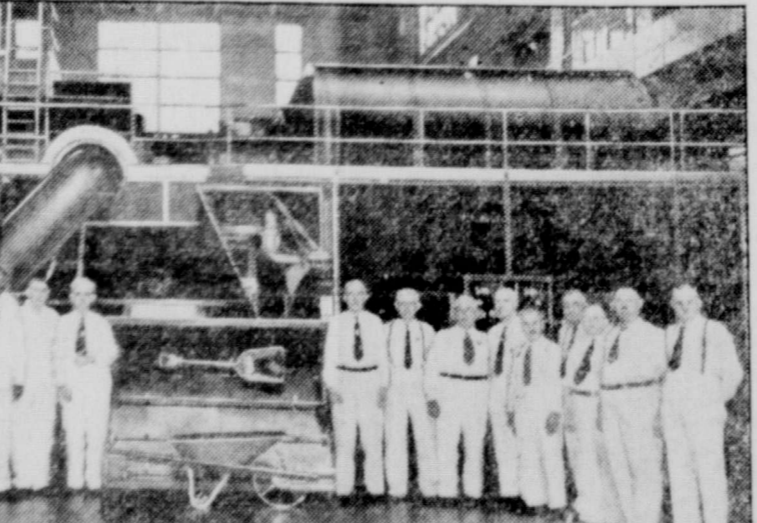
