Guyle Greynolds To Drill Deep Test

RISING STAR, March 6 (Sp.)—Guyle Greynolds of Cisco, the past week moved in a big spudder on the Crownover tract, three miles southwest of town and as soon as the weather is favorable will rig up for a 3000 foot test on a block of acreage assembled by George Goss. The location is in section 26, BBB&C survey, southeast quarter, in Brown county, well should be spudded within the next ten days or two weeks. Geology on the lease is said to be very good, some of the best geologists of the major companies having given favorable reports on it from time to time during the past several years. No other wells have been drilled closer than about one and one half miles of the location.
