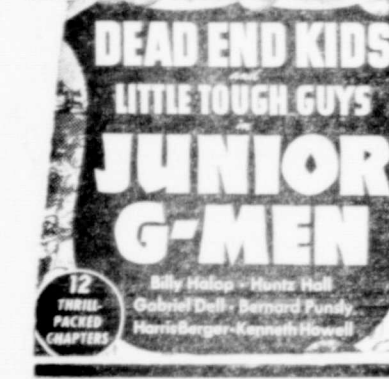

### Blind and Needy Children Get Aid Soon

AUSTIN, June 7.—For the first time in history, the needy blind and destitute children of Texas soon will come in for their share of social security benefits. Officials estimated that 3,000 adult blind and 60,000 neglected boys and girls would be eligible for aid under the recently financed program, inaugurated with legislative approval of a \$22,000,000 tax bill allocating \$1,500,000 annually for child relief and \$400,000 to the sightless.

### Absentee Voting Begins June 9th

EASTLAND, June 7.—County Clerk R. V. Galloway announces the first absentee ballots in the special senatorial election to name a successor to the late Senator Morris Sheppard will be cast. The law states that absentees voting in elections begin 20 days before the election and closes at midnight three days before the election, June 28. However, the 20 days starts today, which is Sunday, when the county clerk's office will be closed, absentee ballots will be cast Monday, June 9, and end June 24.

The county clerk has been advised officially that the names of John R. Brinkley, Democrat, and Inoch Fletcher, Republican, have been withdrawn from the ballot, but the tickets have already been printed and the names cannot be erased.

WICHITA FALLS, June 7.—A low bid of \$4,886,889.39 for construction of facilities for 16,000 men at Sheppard field, air corps technical school, was submitted today by Robert E. McKee Construction Co. of El Paso and Los Angeles.

### Use X-Ray to Test All Aircraft Parts

X-ray testing of all primary airplane parts subject to stress is now becoming standard practice. These tests photograph the intergranular structure of metal and metal parts showing pin holes, fissures and other defects not visible to the eye.

Parts are fed automatically to X-ray machines capable of photographing 5,000 daily.

### Bombers Get New Eyes With Camera

One of the newest weapons of aerial warfare now being installed in a Consolidated Aircraft PBV two-engine patrol bomber in San Diego is a specially built nine-lens camera which can photograph an area of 300 square miles at an altitude of 20,000 feet.

Designed to scout enemy territory for gun emplacements, troop concentrations or large collections this new camera on its first assignment will make an aerial map of San Diego harbor. Later this summer the airplane will take the camera to Alaska, where it will photograph vital areas now being improved for coastal defense.
