CHICAGO, Aug. 13.—The case of a woman weighing 479 1/2 pounds whose weight was reduced by 300 pounds within 18 months by supervised dieting was reported Wednesday in the Journal of the American Medical association. The case was described by Dr. James J. Short of New York, who wrote that the woman, 35 years old, lost her great excess weight without any injury to her health. He emphasized, however, that the weight reduction was undertaken only with the closest supervision, with the patient spending nine months of the reducing period in a nursing home.
