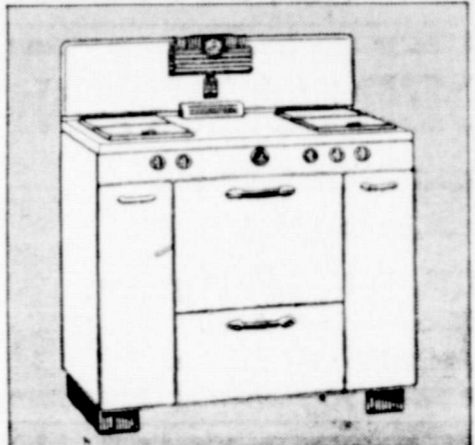

SOUTHWESTERN LIFE SOUND, SERVICEABLE

Of the \$13,589,000 Texas families received from all legal reserve life companies during the first six months of this year in payment of life insurance contracts which became death claims, \$1,503,847 was paid by Southwestern Life Insurance company, and an additional \$82,463 was paid by the company in the form of accidental death claims. This information, compiled by the Institute of Life Insurance, is contained in data received from C. F. O'Donnell of Dallas, Southwestern Life president, by the company's local representative, K. H. Pittard. The data indicated that of the death claims paid a total of \$10,791,000 was to beneficiaries of ordinary life policies, and \$1,520,000 on payroll-deduction plans. In addition to payments to beneficiaries through death claims, living policyowners of Southwestern Life received more than \$1,207,000 during the first six months of 1941 in the form of matured endowments, desirability payments, surrender values, interest, coupons, dividends and annuities, the information from Mr. O'Donnell indicated. That these payments indicate not only the financial relief accorded widows, children and other beneficiaries, but disclose some of the economic significance of life insurance to the state of Texas, was the observation expressed by Mr. Pittard, who has been with the company since 1919.
