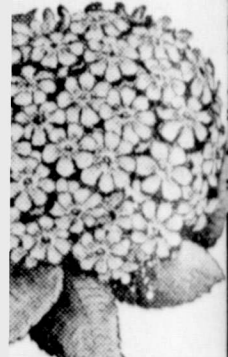

### NEGRO KILLED FIVE

HAMLET, N. C., May 7.—Will Dawkins, 50, negro carpenter who shot and killed five persons, including Hamlet Police Chief John Fallow, was dead Thursday, his body riddled by the guns of a 500-man posse. Hunted since Tuesday morning when he ran amuck and killed his wife, her two sisters and his 2-year-old nephew in addition to Fallow, the negro was trapped Wednesday in the Marks creek swamp, six miles from Hamlet. With bloodhounds chasing him out of a dense undergrowth, Dawkins raced toward the swamp and twice fired his shotgun at possemen before he was downed.
