# **Commissioners renew burn ban for county**

The Castro County Commissioners Court in special session on Thursday voted to extend the burn ban until it "can be safely lifted." As such, the prohibition against outside burning of any type will remain in effect for 90 days or until the county gets enough rain to warrant ending the ban.

County Judge Bill Sava said officials with agencies like FEMA had advised that conditions are still to dry in the area that the ban needs to stay in place.

Two commissioners, Bay Baldridge and Dan Schmucker and Sava attended the meeting. All three voted in favor of extending the ban.

That means no outside fires of any type, including outdoor barbecuing. Anyone who starts a fire outside is subject to a ticket and fine.

"People put themselves in real danger by ignoring the ban," Sava said. "If you deliberately start a fire, you're responsible for it. Usually, if a burn ban is in effect and someone starts a fire intentionally, that person's fire insurance is nullified. Not only will the insurance not pay for damage that you do to your property, you're liable for damage done to anyone else's property - and the insurance won't pay there either."

In other action, the court agreed to appoint Walt Kelley of Amarillo as Regional Unified Command Incident Commander to the Governor's Division of Emergency

#### Management.

"That means if we have an emergency, like a tornado, he'll be able to give us assistance with supplies, equipment, personnel, assuming that the area where he works hasn't been hit," Sava said.

"It's getting more complicated to handle Emergency Management. When I first became County Judge it didn't take very much of my time. Now, hardly a day goes by when I don't have to do something, provide some answers. I don't see it as adding another level of government - I see it as getting assistance if possible in case of an emergency in this county."

Sava, Schmucker and Baldridge all voted in favor of naming Kelley to the post.

\* Decided to offer a health class for high school credit this summer.





"Due to a major concussion this past summer, I was not allowed to participate by my doctors in the sports I love.



All waste and wastewater will be beneficially used on agricultural land.
