ATTACK WAS HEAVIEST EVER MADE BY THESE BIG SHIPS; GERMAN DUNKIRK IS

ALLIED HEADQUARTERS, North Africa, April 1.—An all-out Allied aerial offensive - including an unprecedented raid by about 100 Flying Fortresses — rocked the Axis front and rear lines, a headquarters communique said today as ground fighting in Tunisia slowed down momentarily due to mine fields and stiffer resistance.

The Flying Fortress raid, carried out by nearly 100 great four-motored planes, swept over southern Sardinia and blasted the important Axis port of Cagliari as well as Axis airdromes from which the enemy has tried to dom-CISCO YOUNG inate the Mediterranean narrows. The bombers shot down 14 enemy planes.

> Everywhere along the front Allied planes swept the skies and gave the Luftwaffe the worst pasting of this campaign, shooting down 31 Axis aircraft while losing only 12. (A broadcast from Radio Algiers said that at least 40 or 50 Axis planes were damaged in air combat during the Fortress raid and other operations and that all of the Fortresses returned safely.)

The smashing attack by the Fortresses was the heaviest such raid ever unleashed by these big ships in any theater of war. (In the European theater of operations the biggest American raid yet announced included 115 Fortresses and Liberators.)

On the ground in Tunisia, the British Eighth Army was in contact with Marshal Erwin Rommel's battered Afrika Korps a dozen miles north of Gabes where the enemy, having withdrawn through the Gabes bottleneck, apparently was putting up a stiffer rear guard action in an effort to give Rommel plenty of time to carry out his retirement.

German "Dunkirk."

MADRID, April 1. — Germany has commandeered the Italian fleet and all available KILLED IN A French merchant ships preparatory to an at-MOTOR WRECK tempt to evacuate Italo-German armies from Tunisia in an Axis "Dunkirk," it was reported here today.

Axis sources here calculated that 750,000 tons of shipping would be needed to evacuate b. m. Wednesday. He will be the troops alone, and the removal of tanks, guns and other heavy equipment would boost the tonnage needed to more than 1,000,000.

Reports from Rome said the Axis also has built numerous additional air fields and heavily reinforced fighter and bomber squadrons in Sicily and Southern Italy to provide the most powerful air cover possible for the evacuation.

Though British sources have estimated Axis forces in Tunisia as high as 250,000 to 300,000 men, information here purported to be reliable indicates they number about 180,-

The attempted evacuation - if and when it comes-probably will touch off the biggest sea and air battle of the whole war in the Medi terranean.






