



DANGEROUS SITUATION IS POINTED OUT AS ENEMY'S STRENGTH BUILDS RAPIDLY

MacARTHUR HEADQUARTERS, Australia, April 21.—A spokesman for Gen. Douglas MacArthur warned today that heavy Japanese aid and ground reinforcements are moving into the Southwest Pacific "with great rapidity" as Allied fliers sank another Japanese cargo ship.

Despite Allied successes the past year, "the situation is now becoming more menacing on the Australian front," the spokesman said, adding that is why MacArthur and other leaders are insisting on more equipment.

"It is our hope that our forces will grow to match his," he said. "Our successes in the past are unfortunately not the compelling factor in the coming battle. This campaign, as always is the case in war, will be won in the future, not the past."

A message told of the sinking of a 6000-ton cargo vessel off Wewak, New Guinea, where two convoys have been battered or chased away in recent weeks. The vessel, apparently laden with fuel, exploded following direct hits from 500-pound bombs. A smaller ship, probably a harbor boat, also was hit.

Fires were set in the bombing of airdromes at Wewak and nearby Boram and at Kaimana in Dutch New Guinea. The airdrome at Nubia was hit in a night raid yesterday while other planes strafed villages in the New Guinea Saidor area and ground installations on Kenari Island in the Aroe group.




