

REGULATIONS FOR OVERSEAS CHRISTMAS MAIL

- Christmas parcels mailed to Army personnel only.
- ender should endorse each gift parcel (Christmas Parcel) pounds in weight, or 15 inches in length or 36 inches in length cepted in any one week from the same sender for the same
- board or strong dcuble-faced corrugated fiber-board or strong fully telescoping cardboard boxes. Fiber-board or cardboard boxes must be securely wrapped in strong paper and tied with twine. In addition, senders are cautioned that delays caused by the necessity of censorship will be minimized if the wrapper is secured so as to permit easy inspection of contents.
