#### TREATIES AND THE SENATE.

The defeat of the Treaty of Versailles seems today far less desirable than it did to adherence to the World Court, despite the support of Presidents Harding, Coolidge and Hoover, was denied by the Senate.

This tendency to reject treaties is by no means modern. When John Hay was ambassador to Great Britain under President McKinley, he wrote, "I do not believe that another important treaty will pass the Senate." When he became secretary of state he drafted a treaty with Great Britain preparing the way for the building of the Panama Canal. This was so drastically modified by the Senate that it was laid on the shelf. Hay wrote, "I felt sure that no one out of a madhouse could fail to see that the advant ages were all on our side.
