Final and complete returns in nationwide strike vote of General Motors employees late today favored a pay-gain strike by 70,853 ballots to 12,438.

Regional offices of the Regional Labor Relations Board at Detroit announced the official result in 97 G-M plants where elections were conducted yesterday.

Walter P. Reuther, vice-president of the United Automobile Workers, which had requested the strike approval, said the nearly six to one majority was "a mandate for the union leadership to push the 30 percent wage increase fight to a successful conclusion."

Meantime, a similar strike vote was conducted today among 125,000 Chrysler employees — where the UAW also is seeking a 30 percent pay boost.

Another strike threat appeared today as 12,000 Greyhound bus drivers, maintenance men and terminal employees, east of the Rockies, voted to walk out Oct. 31 unless progress is made in their contract negotiations.

American airlines service was threatened as ground crew members began walking out in three cities in sympathy with workers in the company's export branch.

Mr. Truman to Be Senate - House To Hear Over Air Discuss Tax - Cut Tuesday Night Bill Tomorrow

WASHINGTON, Oct. 25 (AP)—President Truman announced today that he will present the government's reconversion wage-price program directly to the people in a radio address next Tuesday night.

Mr. Truman also announced appointment of John R. Steelman, veteran government labor conciliator, as a special assistant to the chief executive.

PRESIDENT TO TEXAS.

WACO, Oct. 25 (AP)—President Truman is coming to Texas. Officials of Baylor University announced today that the chief executive has accepted an invitation to visit Baylor personally on Dec. 5 and accept an honorary degree at Baylor Centennial ceremonies.

WASHINGTON, Oct. 25 (AP)—The House agreed today to a Senate request for a conference to iron out differences between House and Senate versions of the 1946 tax bill — under which at least 12,000,000 persons will go off the income tax rolls.

After Speaker Sam Rayburn had appointed seven Ways and Means committee members as House conferees, it was announced that they would hold their initial session tomorrow morning. Parliamentarily speaking, the House, in agreeing to the Senate conference request, automatically refused to concur in Senate amendments to the bill.

Both houses were agreed, however, that at least 12,000,000 present taxpayers would owe nothing to the government next year. They also were agreed on repeal of the \$5 a year government auto use tax. They were in accord, too, on freezing the Social Security payroll tax at one per cent each on employe and employer for another year.

Texas CIO Chief Threatens Use of Textile Boycott

DALLAS, Oct. 25 (AP)—A. R. Hardesty, chief of all CIO unions in North Texas, today threatened three Texas cotton mills, which have refused to negotiate settlements with a boycott of their products and sympathy strikes in cotton industries.

OPA Cuts Butter Points From 12 to 8 on Sunday

WASHINGTON, Oct. 25 (AP)—Ration values of butter, margarine, lard, shortening and oils were reduced by the OPA today from 12 to eight points a pound for the rationing period beginning Sunday. Ration values of all meat will remain the same during the Oct. 28-Dec. 1 period, except for a four-to-three point reduction on seven fatty cuts of pork.

Buyers' Spree is Fast Emptying De- partment Stores

FT. WORTH, Oct. 25. — Department store merchants in the Southwest Thursday were scraping the bottom of store shelves as depleted stocks reflected the greatest retail buying spree on record.

WAKAYAMA, Honshu, Japan—The men of this amphibious task force put American occupation troops ashore here Sept. 25. 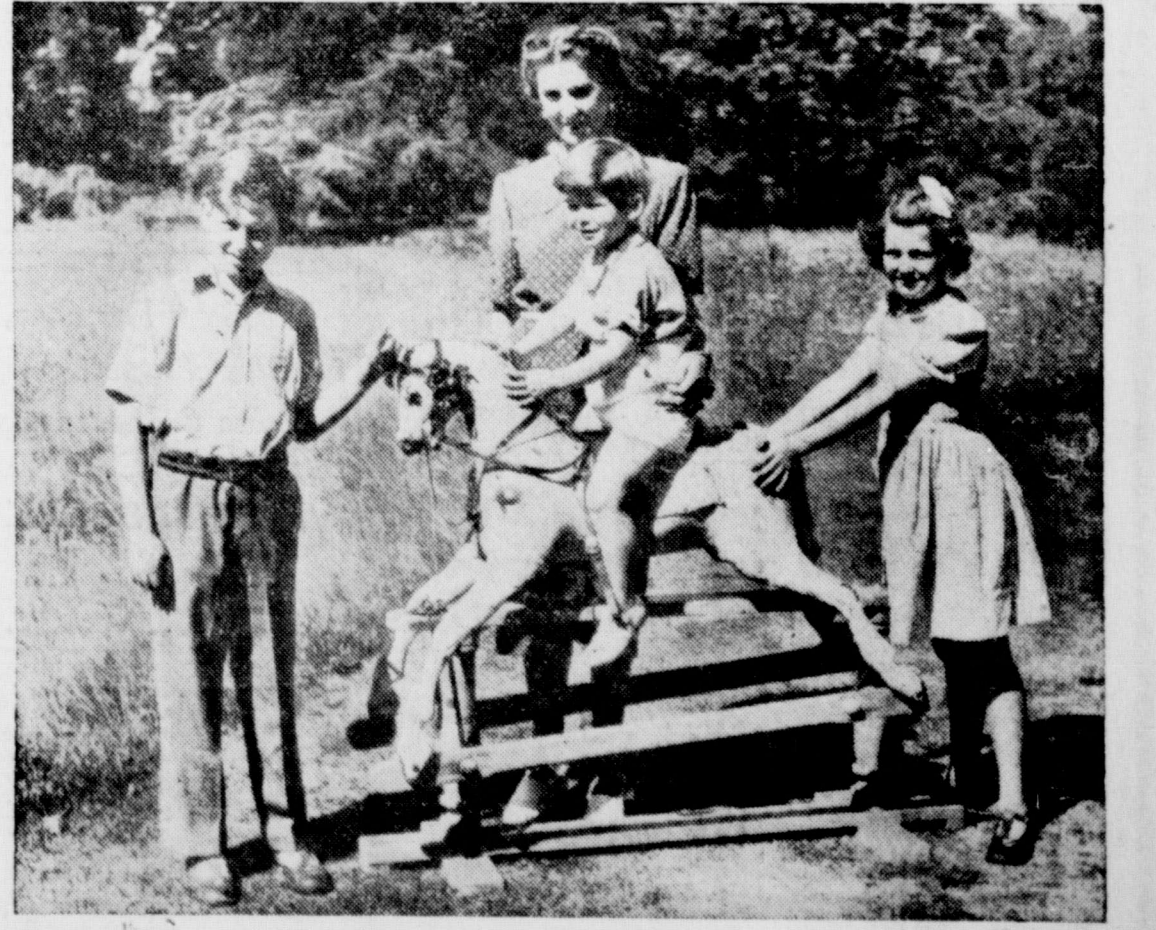

Effective October 15, 1945, Title I home repair and improvement loans are exempt from the credit restrictions of Regulation W. Also, effective the same date, Conservation Order L-41 of the War Production Board was revoked so that it is no longer necessary to obtain a priority to begin construction.

The following terms govern property improvement loans under Title I:

PURPOSE OF LOAN	Maximum Maturity	Maximum Amount
To repair, improve or modernize an existing structure	3 years	\$2,500
To construct a new structure for other than residential use; i.e., garage or commercial buildings	3 years	\$3,000
