President Truman ordered government seizure of the bituminous coal mines today as nationwide embargo on perishable freight and
livestock was reported near in anticipation of the rail strike scheduled for Thursday.

Mr. Truman ordered the Secretary of the Interior to take over and operate the soft coal mines tomorrow.

The mines now are being operated under two-week truce by the United Mine Workers.

The truce expires at midnight Saturday.
There was no positive assurance yet that the miners would continue to work after this
week, even for the government.
