Birds know their fledglings are born to fly, and not to be cuddled forever in a nice nest under sweet-smelling vines. Perhaps if man could skim the tree tops and leave the troubled earth at will, it wouldn't be so hard to see human children grow up and go out the front door. After all, the quiet rooms of a once much-used house have served a purpose, too, like the empty nest in the honeysuckle.

TWO CENTURIES HENCE.

"What will the historian of A. D. 2146 regard as the most important outcome of World War II?" This question, asked of a historian, brought an unexpected reply:

"After the coming of the atomic age, the most important development is the replacement of Russia for Germany as the leading power in Europe. After World War I Germany's place as top power was vacant, but there was no one to take it over except France, with only half Germany's population and almost ruined by her wartime exertions. Today Russia is both willing and able to replace Germany. Eastern Europe, which had been under German overlordship, is now under Russian. And the Russians have freed themselves of the gross inefficiency which pre-

valled under the czars, and got a system of government going which we may not like but which at least is effective.

"Germany will eventually get on her feet economically, but her days as ruler of Europe are gone for as far ahead as the eye can see."

The five ex-service men who have been taking flying as a related subject to their work at Cisco Junior College have completed the first ten hours.

All their students made their first solo flight in less than eight hours and no accidents have occurred during their training. Whether or not flying will be offered during the summer term has not been decided. As soon as plans are determined an announcement will be made.

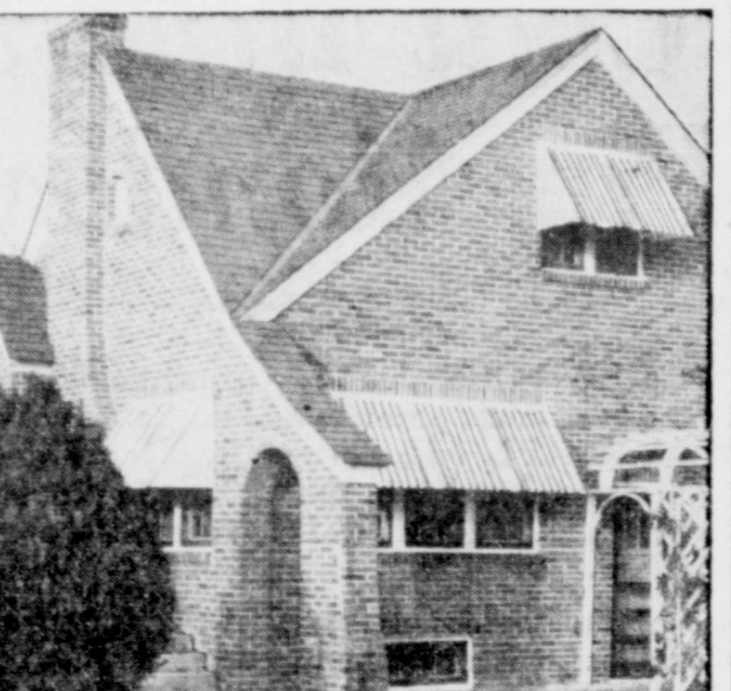
Cisco Junior College should be complimented on their progressive attitude toward this type of training. Many of the larger universities have lately taken note of this trend and offered flying as a part of their curriculum. Educators are beginning to realize that aviation is an established industry and that students should be trained to take their place in aviation as they are trained for engineering, medicine or law.

Intensive flying courses designed to prepare pilots for commercial flying have been made available under the "G. I. Bill." However, only certificated flying schools can offer this training. As yet we do not have the facilities here to qualify for this rating.
