## US. Lays Down Law to Yugoslavia, Red Mouthpiece

### Jaycees Invite the More Than 600 Public to Meeting of Mitcham Hereford Herd Sold

Regular meeting of Cisco Jaycees will be held at Laguna hotel at 7:30 o'clock Monday night instead of at 8 as heretofore, says J. D. Lauderdale.

The finance committee, which has just completed the budget, will make its report and there will also be reports from the committees in charge of football, safety, health and social affairs.

Following the business period, Coaches Harold Fischer and V. C. Overall will conduct a short quarter-back session in which the last two Lobo games will be discussed. Then will come the showing of a moving picture of the Texas University-T. C. U. football game of last year.

All Jaycees, said Mr. Lauderdale, are asked to attend this meeting prepared to settle for their season football tickets, so the club can make settlement with the school board on Tuesday morning. Those unable to be present Monday night should contact Sterling Drumwright at once.

Mr. Lauderdale wants to make it plain that the general public has a cordial invitation to attend the Monday night meeting, see the football picture and participate in the quarterback discussions.

Selling in the Mitcham ranch dispersal auction was completed near 3:30 o'clock Saturday afternoon, after a day and a half of bidding by more than 400 buyers here from almost every cattle-producing section of the United States.

The herd of nurse cows were the last animals to go under Auctioneer Earl Gartin's hammer.

More than 600 individuals of the fine Mitcham herd of foundation Hereford stock were sold during the two days.

Bidding began at 1 o'clock Friday afternoon and was resumed at 10 o'clock Saturday morning.

Lunch was served on both days to the visitors and buyers, a large tent having been erected near the show barns, 12 miles northwest of Cisco, to shelter the diners.

An average of better than \$300 per animal was realized during the sale, with a top of \$1,075.

Manager F. W. Alexander of Albany, who planned and directed the big dispersal auction, expressed himself as well pleased with the result.

This sale marks the closing out of one of the finest foundation Hereford herds in west Texas, following the death early this month of its founder, G. P. Mitcham, who built it over a period of about ten years. The grade cattle herd of the Mitcham estate, located on a ranch a few miles from the ranch headquarters, was not sold.

Mr. Mitcham planned for the sale of his registered herd several months before his death and secured Mr. Alexander, a prominent Albany rancher and one of the most successful breeders of registered stock in this section, to manage the sale.

### Mr. Truman Has Faith in Stalin Peace Talk

WEST POINT, Sept. 28. (U.P.)—President Truman today expressed confidence that the world is entering into an era of "permanent peace."

In an informal talk to 2,100 West Point cadets at their noon mess, he reaffirmed his faith in peace following Russian Premier Josef Stalin's statement in Moscow that he saw no danger of war.

Foreign Minister Ernest Bevin of Britain agreed with Stalin's appraisal of the world situation in a speech yesterday.

Mr. Truman flew back to Washington tonight.

### Men Who Begin Wars Should Pay Piper With Lives

NUERNBERG, Sept. 28. (U.P.)—The four judges of the International Tribunal today set a seal on their completed verdict which, when read in court Monday and Tuesday, will write into international law the new concept that men who begin wars of aggression are guilty of murder and crimes against humanity.

Shrouded in greatest secrecy while it was being formulated, the first half of the verdict will be revealed to the world Monday.

The first part is expected to state the guilt or innocence, the second the sentences.

PARIS, Sept. 28. — Yugoslavia bluntly threatened not to sign the peace treaty with Italy today and to keep her army in northwest Istria in a flaming verbal outburst against a conference compromise on the Yugoslavia-Italian frontier.

The U. S. immediately retaliated with a threat to bar Yugoslavia from any reparations or any other benefits of the Italian treaty unless she agreed to sign it and live up to all its provisions.

The American resolution was approved by the Italian political commission, but failed to get the two-thirds vote necessary to make it a recommendation to the Big Four.

The row in the commission produced the angriest words yet spoken in Luxembourg Palace since the 21 nations met six weeks ago to try to make peace treaties for Italy and four Nazi satellites.

### Golf Tournament for Men and Women Starts Today

A Cisco city-wide golf tournament will get under way today, says Gene Damron.

Flights for both men and women will be carried, with a championship flight for each.

An invitation is extended, said Mr. Damron, to every man and woman in Cisco to compete and, "should you not be a goifer, you are welcome to watch the matches as they are played." The tournament will be held on the Country club golf course.

A qualifying score, 18-hole medal play, is to be played and completed by October 6—scores to be turned in at the golf house.

Medalist prizes for both men and women will be awarded, and players will be matched according to their scores.

First round medalists will be played from October 7 until October 14. Second round matches, October 14 until October 21. Third round matches, October 21 until October 28.

Final round match will be played Sunday, November 2.

The tournament will be conducted according to PGA regulation and local ground rules. Dr. Paul M. Woods and Norman Huston compose the Rules committee.

The entrance fee has been placed at \$1 and all monies will be used to provide prizes. Prizes will be awarded to each flight's first, second and third-place winner. Each player will be required to pay greens fees for each match or round played.

The Tournament committee is composed of Gene Damron, Ralph Glenn, Gene Abbott and J. L. Thornton.

### PAULEY TO LONDON?

WASHINGTON, Sept. 28.—Edwin W. Pauley is a good bet for ambassador to London, the post just vacated by Harriman. Mr. Truman has been using him in international field, still smarting from senatorial rejection of Pauley for Navy undersecretary. Chances are Senate would confirm him. Many opponents last winter said it was the only Navy job they thought he shouldn't have.

### SENATE TO INVESTIGATE.

WASHINGTON, Sept. 28.—Senate investigation of U.S. forces in Germany may prove sensational. It will look into charges of widespread immorality and promiscuity among officers as well as enlisted men, black-market operations. Army has been trying for months to clean things up, apparently has not succeeded. Rumor is that Gen. Clay wants to quit, and Senate investigation may bring this to head. Clay is well thought of here and probably would be hard to replace.

### San Antonio Flash Flood Cost \$8 Million, Six Lives

SAN ANTONIO, Sept. 28. (U.P.)—The official death toll in San Antonio's havoc-wreaking flash flood stood at six tonight, as military authorities disclosed that four MP's previously included among the missing have been found.

Harry Roberson, provost marshal for San Antonio, said the men have been accounted for in the disaster caused by the flood, which left an estimated \$8,000,000 of damage in its wake.

Crest of the remaining flood is expected at Falls City shortly after midnight.

### MEAT CONTROL PREDICTION.

WASHINGTON, Sept. 28. — Despite Truman statement, despite Anderson speech, despite Hannegan backdown, look for administration to surrender eventually on meat controls. In big cities it will take several weeks, perhaps month, after controls are lifted before much meat reaches retail stores.

### 1946 - 47 Term Be Dallas Team Biggest Year at Masonic Degree in Cisco

The Cisco Public schools are well launched on their 1946-47 term with an increase of between 75 and 100 students over the enrollment last year, Supt. R. N. Cluck said. There are about 35 more students enrolled in the high school.

At Cisco Junior college, which has entered what will no doubt be its biggest year, the enrollment is between 35 and 40 per cent over last year's peak, Mr. Cluck said.

There were the usual problems concerning teacher vacancies and schedules to be ironed out during the first two weeks, but all of these have been solved and students and faculty alike are working enthusiastically, the superintendent said.

Cisco Junior college is making particularly good progress this season, both in enrollment and in quality of work being done.

The college recently obtained 28 federal emergency apartments to house married ex-service men students and these buildings are now under construction on the campus.

There are seven of them, each containing four apartments. Four of the buildings were up and the foundations and part of the walls of the other three are in place.

The 33d degree team of the Dallas consistory, with W. A. Browning, lecturer; A. D. Fraser, worshipful master; A. Frank Hamm, senior warden; C. A. Egbert, senior warden; Luther E. Wilson, senior deacon; Sam Marks, junior warden and Leon B. Shaw, master of ceremonies, conferred a master Mason degree upon Harry Ashton in Cisco lodge hall, Friday night. Mr. Browning was introduced by R. E. Grantham of Cisco, district deputy grand master of the 73d Masonic district, to Charles Clark, worshipful master of the Cisco lodge, and the other brethren.

These brethren were assisted by G. R. Kilpatrick, Capt. George Lamar, Haywood Cabaness, Joe Brittain and E. H. Hester.

The meeting was attended by approximately 150 Masons from Rising Star, Cross Plains, Putnam, Gorman, Moran, Albany, Carbon, Ranger, Eastland, Cisco, Breckenridge, Strawn, Monahans and Louisiana.

The degree was unusually well conferred and was very much appreciated by all present. The men composing the degree team are successful business men of Dallas, ranging in age from 60 to 76 years, and for the past 30 years have devoted much of their time to the advancement of Masonry.

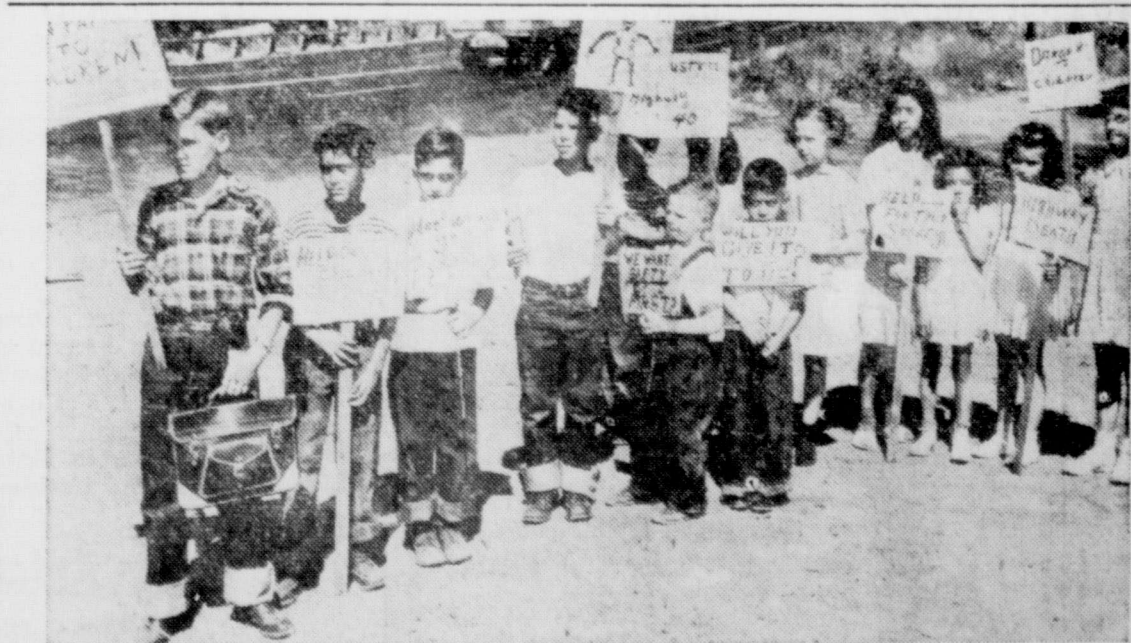

I Cor. 14:15 says, "I will SING with the spirit; I will SING with the understanding also." Therefore singing — vocal music — is certainly authorized in the scriptures as acceptable praise to God, and is therefore of faith.

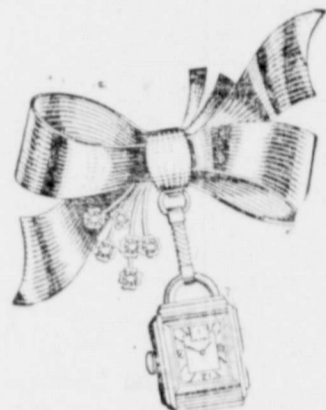

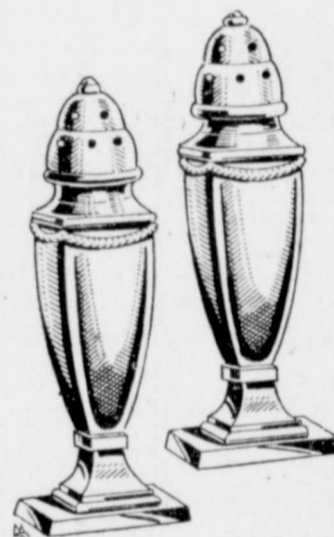
