### Penney Manager is Pleased With His First Year Here

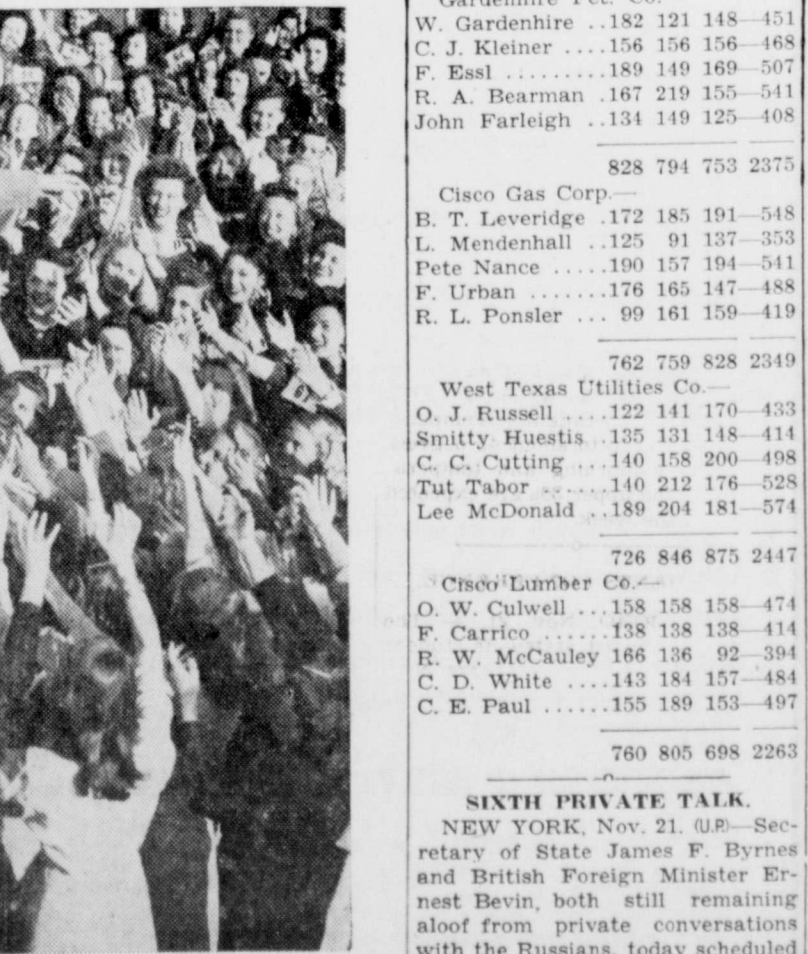

### Special Election May be Necessary Because of Death

AUSTIN, Nov. 21. — Gov. Coke Stevenson announced last night that he would begin immediately an investigation regarding manner of naming a successor to the late E. J. Miller of Brownwood as associate justice of 11th district court of civil appeals in Eastland.

He made no comment in response to a statement by Taylor county Judge Wiley Caffey Tuesday that a special election must be held to elect a successor to the late Judge Miller, according to Article 2953a, sub-section six of the Revised Civil Statutes of the State of Texas.

Judge Caffey said the article specifically states an election must be called immediately by the proper official in cases where a duly elected official dies before taking office. Judge Caffey declared the proper official to be the governor.

### House Democrats Begin Drive For Rayburn of Texas

WASHINGTON, Nov. 21. — A "draft Rayburn" drive was started today by House Democrats seeking to avert a leadership fight that might wind up with an anti-administration man as official House spokesman for the party.

It grew out of reiteration by Sam Rayburn of Texas of his intention not to accept the post of Democratic floor leader to which he normally would revert when Republicans take over control of the House Jan. 3 and he steps down as speaker.

Rayburn's re-emphasis of his intention to sidestep the floor leadership was made in response to a request by Representative Sparkman of Alabama that the Texan reconsider his earlier decision.

### Bedridden Woman of 82 Evicted from Denver Home

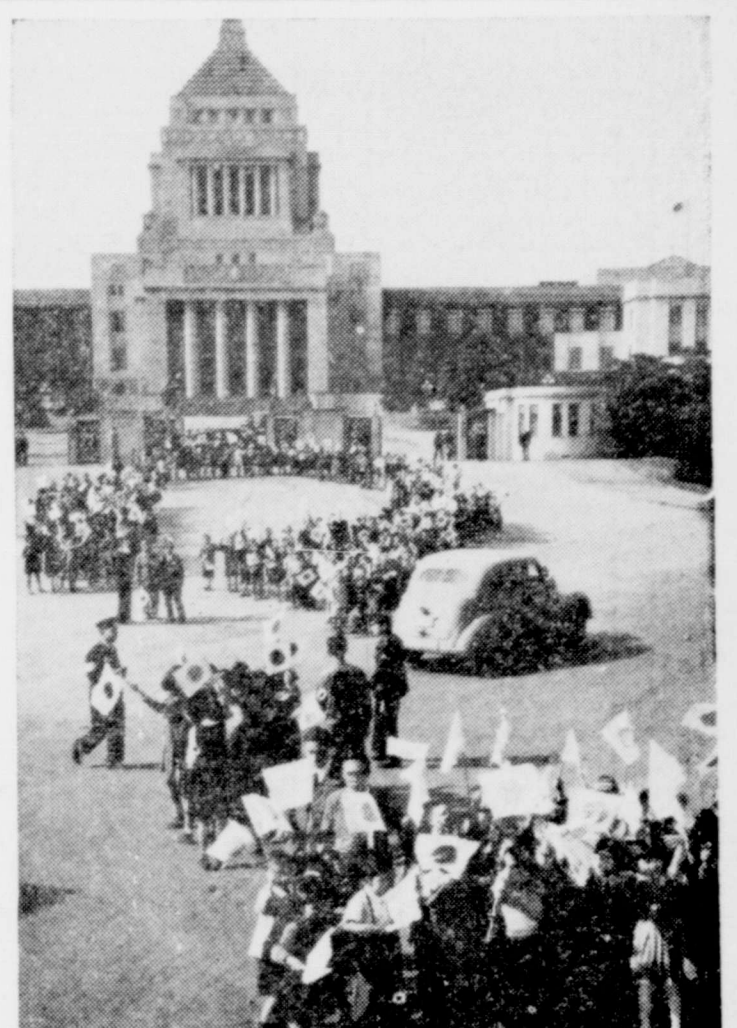

The following very complimentary review of the violin recital presented by Miss Gloria Graham, daughter of Dr. and Mrs. E. L. Graham of Cisco, in Scott Hall, Dallas, Tuesday evening, appeared in the Thursday issue of the Dallas News.

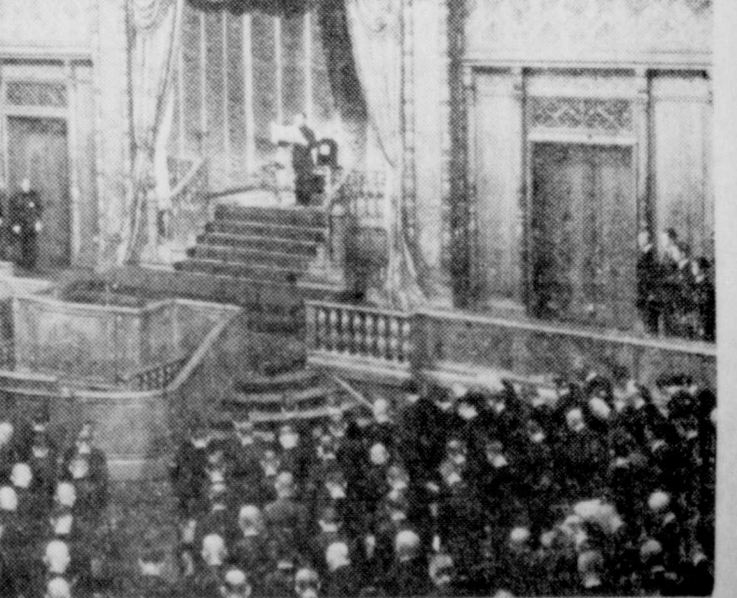
The review was written by Peggy Louise Jones, music critic on the staff of the Dallas News.

Miss Graham was heard by quite a number of her Cisco friends who went to Dallas for the concert. She was one of the finalists in the contest to choose a soloist for the Dallas Symphony Orchestra, and earned generous praise for her performance in the auditions for that purpose.

Following is the review: "Gloria Graham, 20-year-old violinist from Cisco, Texas, played the second recital on Civic Federation's 1946-47 Student Artist Series Tuesday evening in Scott Hall. The program was well chosen, short and sweet, and assisted by Walter Robert functioning in the rare art of fine piano accompaniment. Miss Graham displayed promise and poise.

"An effective warmup session with the brief and ingratiating Vivaldi-Respighi Sonata in D preceded the major work of the evening, Lalo's 'Symphonie Espagnole.' With a tone that is broad, rarely coarse, sometimes silken and sweet the young violinist read it meditatively, as 'such stuff as dreams are made on' rather than with sensuous color.

"Of the concluding group, Wieniawski's 'Polonaise Brillante' Opus 4 was a tour de force successfully executed. What Miss Graham really put her heart and her best

## POLITICAL SWEEPING.

From politics the American people begin turning to economic, which is a collateral branch of knowledge in which most of us are not very apt. We are capable of learning, however, and some of our recent and current lessons are rather illuminating. They seem to sink home more readily among our ordinary folks than among some of the experts, but the latter are waking up.

Here is another example of the old American principle, proved in many a doubtful situation, to "give the people light and they will find their own way." They will find it in peace as they have found it in war. But in the process a lot of

mental and moral kinks and economic nonsense have to be swept out, and a surprising number of eager citizens are demanding "Where's that broom?"

## MORAL RIFT.

The issue at stake in the war just past was not economic but moral, according to Stanley High, magazine editor and writer, in a recent speech. Our ideal, and that of Great Britain, he said, is that of the sacredness of man the individual.

Hitler's regime and the present one of the U. S. S. R. have had one basic principle in common. It is the idea that the individual is nothing, the state is all. That is the point of greatness divergence

between their philosophy and our own. The sacredness of individual rights is the idea which underlies our insistence upon the right of small nations to carve out their own destinies, rather than to be swallowed up by large, powerful governments.

Step by step, too slowly, no doubt, to suit our national impatience, we are making it clear to the disciples of tyranny that we are willing and able to stand by our national ideal with all the resources at our command.
