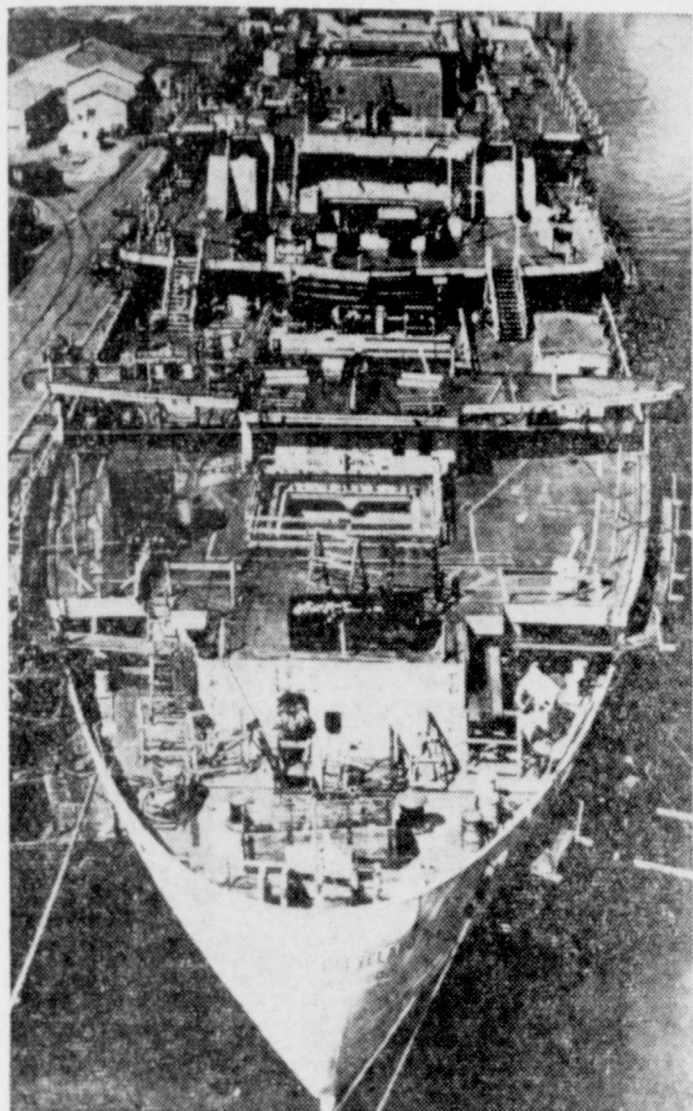

Marshall Got Gop Okay in Breath-taking Time

Humble Lectures W. H. Grozier, 86 in Science Continue at Baytown Former Cisco Man, Buried Here Today

HOUSTON, Jan. 8. — Dr. R. C. Fuson of the University of Illinois, who will begin a week of lectures on January 13 at Humble Oil & Refining company's Baytown refinery, is the third nationally known scientist to participate in the "Humble Lectures in Science" series.

William Henry Grozier, 86 years of age and a former resident of Cisco, died at 12:45 this morning at the home of his son Tom Grozier in San Saba.

The funeral was held at Thomas chapel, Cisco, at 4 this afternoon, with burial in Oakwood cemetery beside his wife, who died January 31, 1939. Rev. Mr. Taylor, retired Baptist minister of Rising Star, officiated. Pallbearers were Thurman Carr, Arthur Courtney, Arthur Ivey, Cal Hatten, Bill Jacobs, Fred Grist, J. C. Carr.

Mr. Grozier was born in Houston, Tex., December 18, 1860, and was united in marriage to Cynthia Jane Phillips February 8, 1882, at Cleburne. They came to Cisco in 1880, but following her death he went to San Saba to live with his son. He was a plumber by trade. Five children were born of this union, three of whom are living, as follows: W. M. Grozier, Cisco; Mrs. B. W. Martin, Big Spring; Thomas Grozier, San Saba. A brother, Thomas Grozier, lives at Temple. There are also eight grandchildren and two great grandchildren.

WASHINGTON, Jan. 8. — The Senate today unanimously confirmed appointment of Gen. George C. Marshall as secretary of state to succeed James F. Byrnes, resigned.

Approval of the nomination came with breath-taking speed after the Senate waived its own rules requiring that nomination "lie over" one day before final action.

Thus Marshall was approved as successor to Secretary of State James F. Byrnes without even an informal appearance before the committee. It was a tribute to the five-star general of a kind rare in Senate annals.

A few minutes before, Chairman Arthur H. Vandenberg, R., Mich., of the foreign relations committee, had promised the world that his party would continue support of a bi-partisan foreign policy under Marshall.

Between Vandenberg's appearance on the Senate floor and final confirmation of the new secretary, the foreign relations committee had met, discussed the nomination briefly and approved it unanimously.

While he was being paid this tribute, Marshall was flying home from 13 arduous months of effort in China to persuade conflicting groups there to end their civil warfare.

He is expected here in about 10 days after a brief rest in Hawaii.

RANGERS TO THWART CHICAGO GANGSTERS

DALLAS, Jan. 8 (UP) — Dallas Times Herald said today it had learned that state police officials, headed by Texas Rangers, were in midst of a drive to clamp a lid on gambling throughout the state.

The newspaper stated it understood the drive was an aftermath of the recently widely publicized case in which Chicago gangsters attempted to bribe Dallas county's new sheriff, Steve Guthrie, for protection in Dallas county.

"The lid is on in Dallas and Fort Worth," Ranger Capt. M. T. Gonzales said in Dallas today. "There is no question about that."

GOP Closed Shop Too Many Pardons Legislation May Cause Spread of Hurtful Stories

WASHINGTON, Jan. 8 (UP) — Republican leaders in both Senate and House pushed ahead today with plans for new labor legislation.

In the Senate, high priority was given legislation which would overturn lawsuits claiming nearly 4 billion dollars in back overtime pay for portal to portal time. Leaders hoped it would be ready for committee consideration next week.

In the House, a strategy meeting was scheduled for Friday to decide upon details of an overall labor bill. There were strong indications that House Republicans would write a bill to ban or restrict the closed union shop.

Independent union leaders from five eastern states planned to place their case before Sen. Joseph H. Ball, R., Minn., who has promised a bill to outlaw the closed shop. They scheduled a conference with Ball on proposed labor legislation.

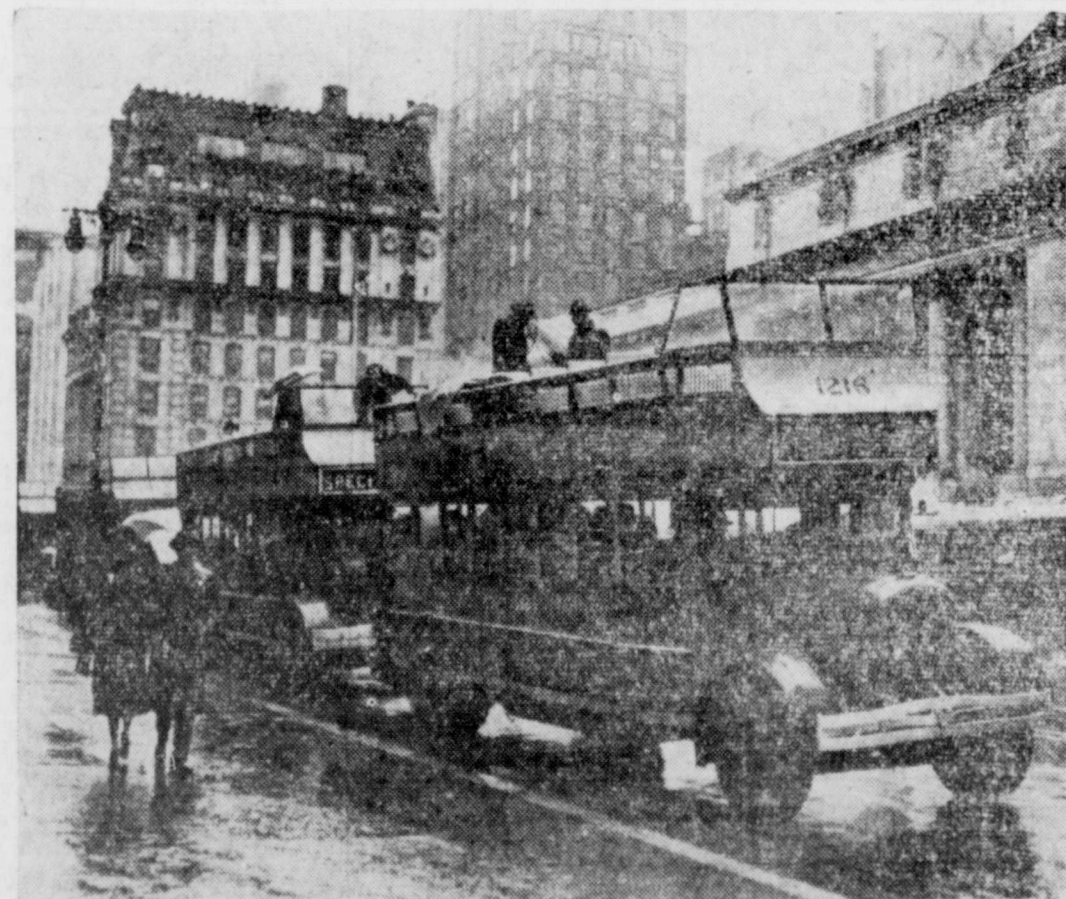

"I've been hearing such convict rumors for twenty years," Board Member Lewis said. "I'm surprised that Riley Wyatt paid any attention to such reports."

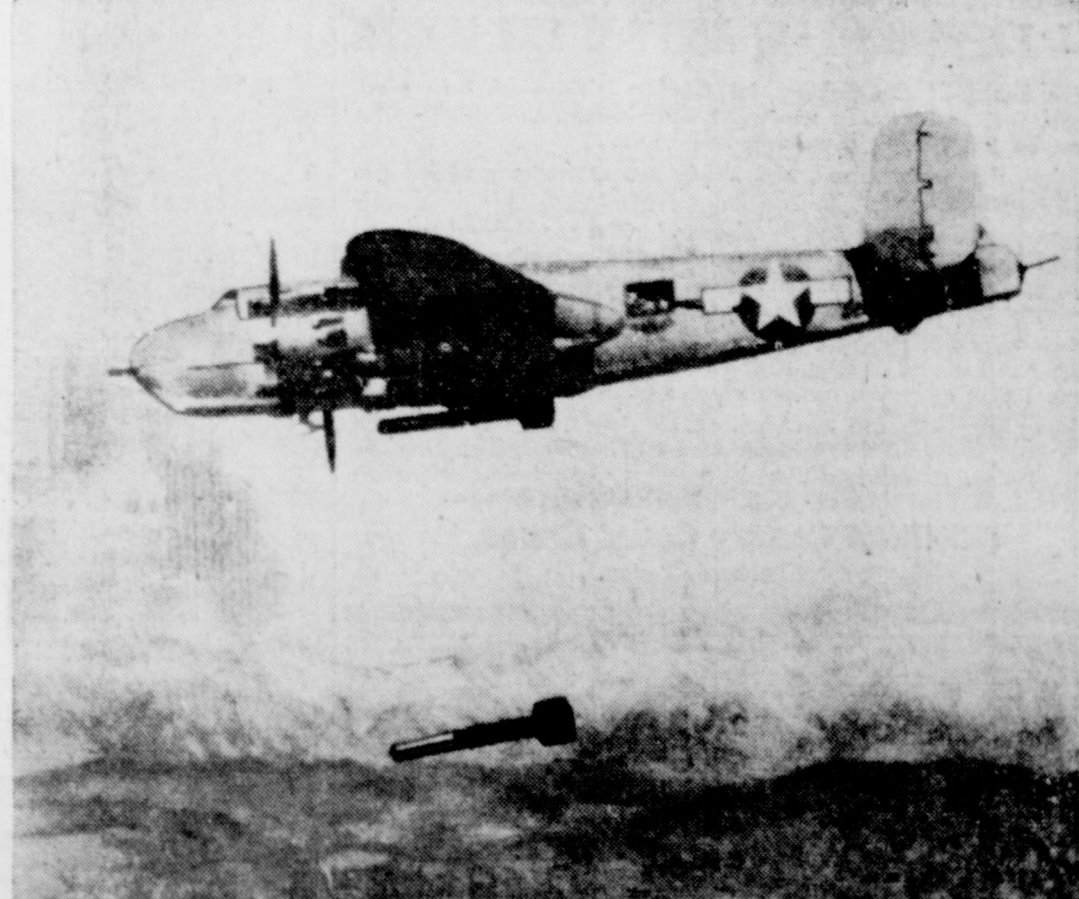
Board Member Walter C. Strong had no comment to make. Board Chairman Elster M. Halle was en route here from Huntsville and not available for comment.

He should be helped and encouraged, thinks Mr. Patri, whether the undertaking be sculpture, boat-building, archaeology, automobile mechanics. The carrying-through to completion of any project, however visionary, is a step in growth toward maturity of character.

It may be added that only by working hard at several occupations, thus learning their advantages and drawbacks from his own standpoint, can any young person be sure of finally following a line he may end in some field which seems far removed from the experiment of youth, but if the course be traced, it will usually be found that the experiments had an influence, either for or against the field maturely chosen.

Girls need to try things, too. People sometimes say, "Look at Jane! She spent all that time studying music and then got married and wasted it by doing housework and bringing up children."

But it wasn't wasted. She sings to and with the children. She acquired manual dexterity and knows how to apply it to learning a new task. She learned much about rhythm, harmony, order and co-operation, which every well-run household needs.

No knowledge is wasted, no experiment performed in vain. But let us finish what they start, learn to attack tasks of a size not too big to finish.

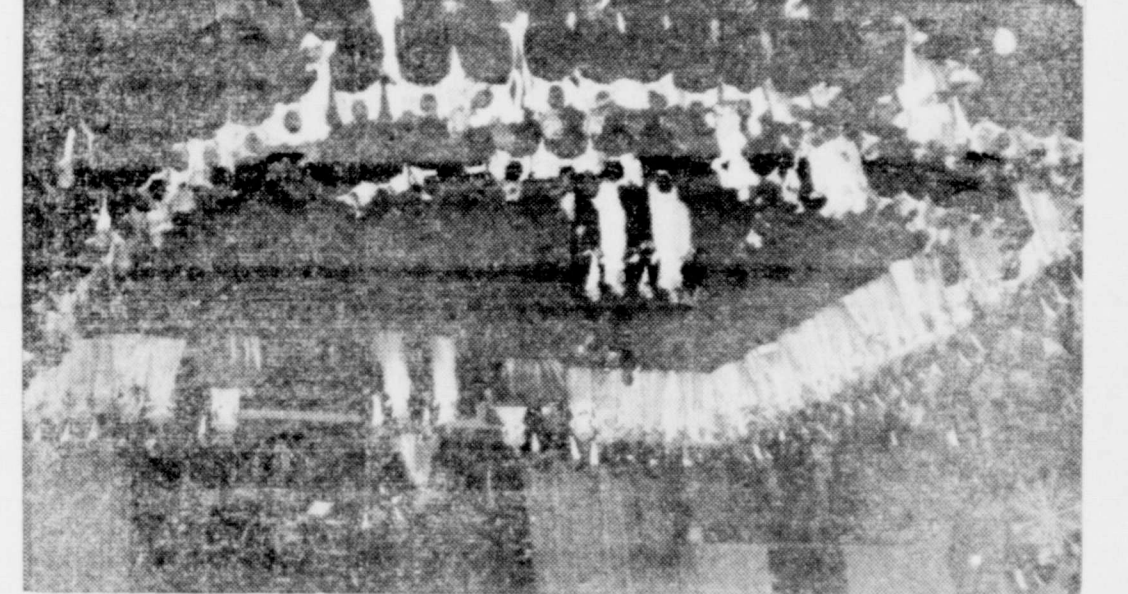
