## PEOPLE AS THEY ARE.

The spotlight of the world is turned on the new Secretary of State, Gen George C. Marshall. His opinions and ideas as expressed when he was the Army's Chief of Staff become significant. In a speech a few years ago before the American Academy of Political Science, he said:

"We must take the nations of the world as they are, the human passions and prejudices of people as they exist and try to find some way to secure a free America in a peaceful world."

United Automobile Workers Union and of the Allis-Chalmers Farm Equipment Co., conferred. The strike has been running nine months. The minister is a 37-year-old Methodist preacher, Rev. Ensworth Reiser who had become acquainted with Walter Reuther, C. I. O. president, and other union officials, during his former pastorate at the Ford Memorial Church in Detroit. After the meeting Reuther announced certain proposals had come from company officials that would be submitted to the union's policy committee.

With spring around the corner farmers hope that strike will soon be settled. It would be strange if a young preacher could get men back to work and tractors and plows on the assembly line again where others had failed. It almost looks as if there were some place for the church in present day society, despite the pessimists.

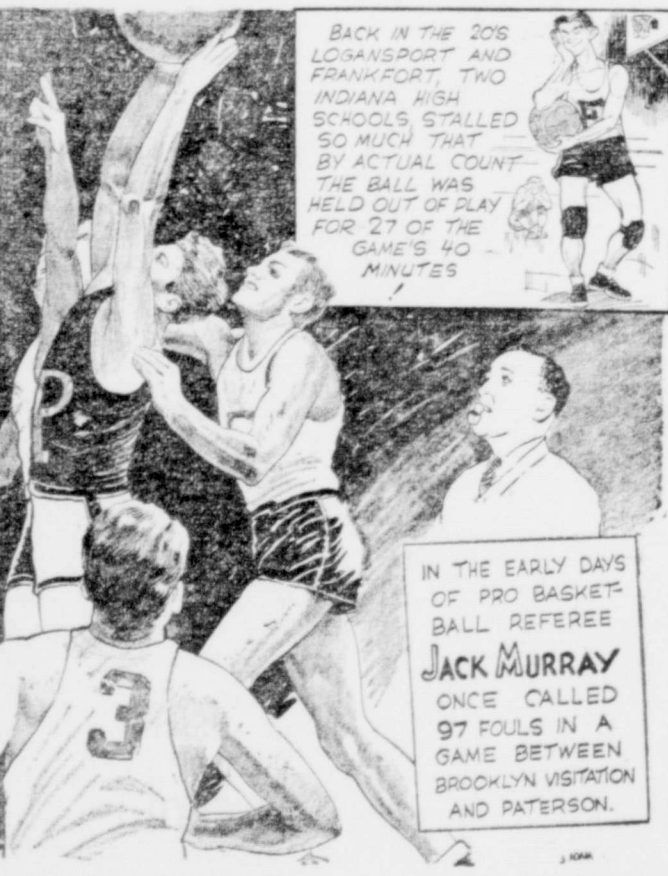

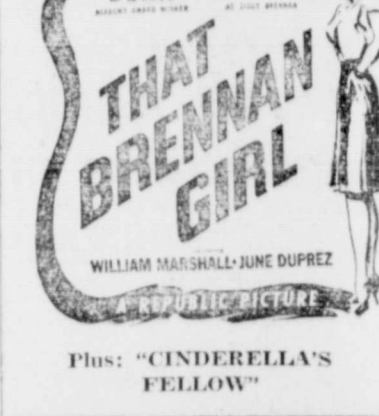

Watson plans to major in mathematics. She is a graduate of Cisco high school and attended Cisco Junior college the past mid-term.

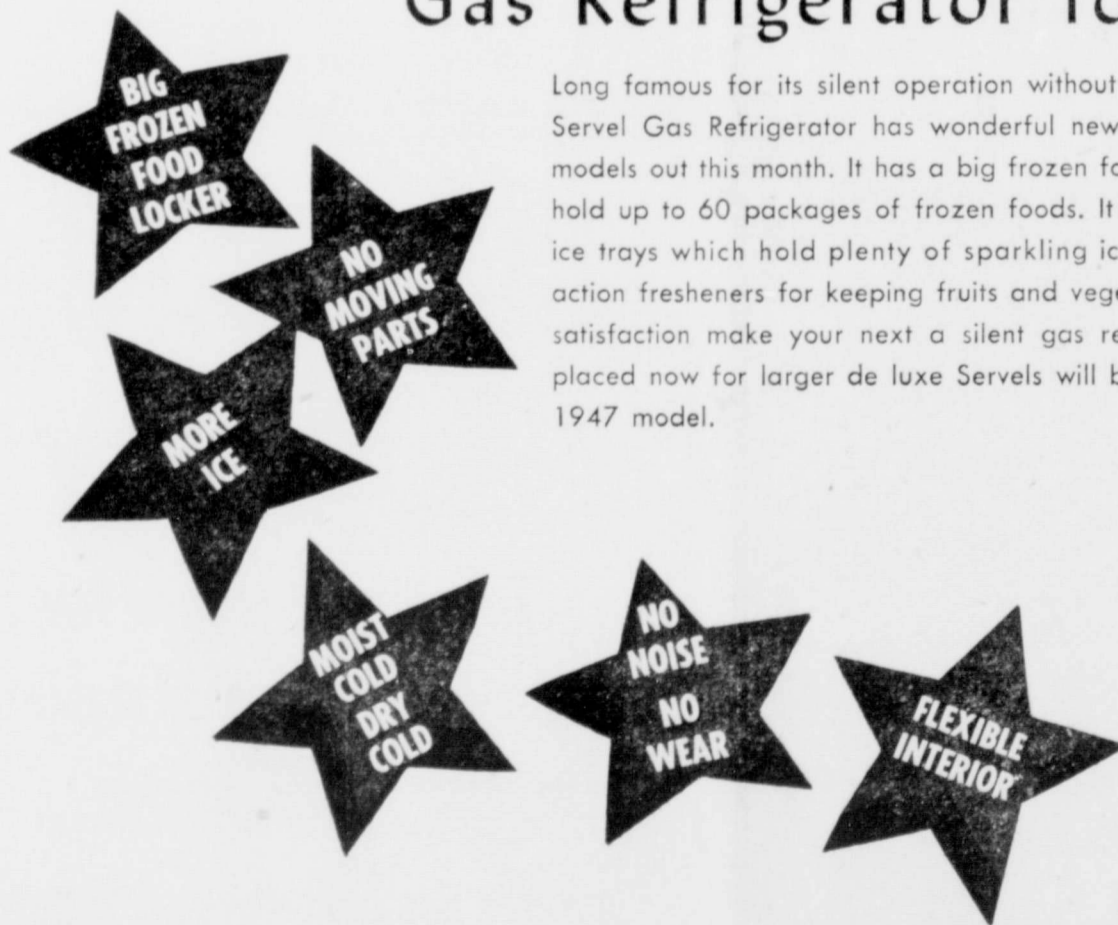
