The rights of the young men and the young women of Texas, as well as the safety and prosperity of the Commonwealth, demand that these institutions be placed upon a plane of reputable efficiency
A sure and ready means of ac A sure and ready means of accomplishing this acceptable and patriotic service is at hand. On
the 19th day of next July the the 19th day of next July the voters of Texas will have an opportunity to amend the Consti cution in such a way as to giv prompt and permanent relief to
