



## Normal College

### Canyon, Texas

The West Texas State Normal College is nine years old, having opened its first regular session September 20, 1910. During this short time more then 5,000 people have received instruction here. Beginning with a student body of some 200, the summer session just closed had an enrollment of 780 and the total enrollment of the year, including regular and summer term, is 1353.

The West Texas State Normal College has a faculty of 46 specialists. These men and women have been selected with special reference to their ability as educators and are recognized leaders in their respective fields. They are big of mind and large of heart and easily find their way into the lives of the young people they touch.



#### WEEKLY CLUB LETTER TO BOYS

(By W. H. Darrow, County Agt.) Visiing with club boys and inspecting some of their pigs have convinced me that many of the members who are raising gilts and male hogs are making the mistake of fatening them instead of conditioning them, that is, putting them in ideal shape for breeding purposes. No greater mistake can be made in raising hogs than to get a sow or male fat, because the pigs from such crosses are apt to be flabby and weak rather than virile and strong in addition, a fat sow usually makes a poor mother because she is very liable to crush some of the pigs in their early days.

Some members have the mistaken idea that it is necessary for them to put a whole lot of weight on their gilt or male or sow in order to win a prize, but such is far from the case. Take a gilt, for example, she will be judged almost entirely as to her fitness to raise pigs, that is, her bone and frame and general form and condition will be the factors that will decide whether she is a prize wnner or nct. The pounds she has gained will be considered also, but that will not count for nearly as much as her condition. The cost of whatever gain she has made will count nearly twice as much in awarding the prizes as will the amount of that gain. The same holds with the male. If you bring in a gilt or male or sow in fat condition you will have a very slight chance of winning.

For those who have such pigs as mentioned above, continue giving a growing feed, like green stuff, pastur age, milk, slop, soaked oats or barley. or shorts. Don't fed a great deal of maize or corn chops or any such fattening feed. This does not mean to shut the pig off from any corn or maize at all, but simply to be careful not to feed very much of it. Make such feed one quarter or less of the entire amount. Ground or soaked pats or barley make an excellent grow ing feed for swine, and one or the other of them is plentiful in nearly every neighborhood now. Try it out for your own satisfaction. Continue this feeding until the Fair, always guarding against the production of meat hog to be just as fat as a hog eneral Land Agent and Abstractor fat. Feed all that the pig will clean can be.


