COTTON SHORTAGE MAY FACE

Washington, April 10.-Warning that the southern farmers will not consent longer to toil fwelve months of each year in the production of cotton for which he cannot get a fair price was given today by Representative Aswell of Lousiana, speaking in

ton at a profit," Mr. Aswell said, "the world problem of the future will not be how to get cheap cotton, but the question with the cotton mills and the onsumer will be how to get cotton

For fifty years Mr. Aswell said, the southern farmer has received less than one half the actual cost of producing cotton with the result that his family have been slaves his children toiling in the fields when they should have been at school. And yet it should be charged that cotton land owners were making excessive profits, as shown by the tremendous increase of deposits in southern banks.

Mr. Aswell quoted the department of justice to show that the average cost of producing cotton in 1918 was 35.5 cents a pound as compared with a price of 28.75 cents. Production-costs in 1919 increased, he said, to at least 44 cents while the price went up to only 31.2 cents

He quoted prices paid by mills to show that the cost of the staple to spinners was \$220,600,000 more than received by the farmers and declared the cotton producer received a small er share of the profits from his work than any other farmer in the world.

Mr. Aswell gave instances of price increases in other commodities, to show that the price of cotton had advanced less proportionately as compar ed with potash, leather and tin plate and called attention particularly to a recent stock dividend of 100 per cent by a New England cotton mill. He charged English mills were making enough profits out of American cotton and with dessimenating propaganda like the mills in England, intended to stampede the southern farmers into accepting a lower price for his sta

FARM LABOR PROBLEMS

That the agricultural situation of the country is more acute than is realized by the majority of the people is the belief of Colonel Frank P. Holiand, prominent farmer and publisher of Holland's Magazine and Farm and Ranch at Dallas, "Some may call me a pessimist," he added, "but I predict that we are going to get hungry this year. We have a large demand right here at home for our farm products, and our export demand is going to drain our resources

ever before and laborers are demanding from \$3 to \$5 a day, and an eighthour day at that," said Colonel Holland. "This is belond the price that farmers are in position to pay. To meet this demand would take all the revenue the farmers derive from their crops, leaving not the wherewithal to support thetaselves and families. Farmers are the only class of workingmen who haven't received an increase in prices for the products of the labor commensurate with the increased price of production."

Prices of farm products in many instances are lower now than they were a year ago, he pointed out. For instance, last summer hogs rose as high as 23c a pound on foot, while now they are bringing less than 15c a pound on foot. As a result, he said, many hogs raisers will not produce meat for the market this year

Likewise the acreage of land tilled this year will be below the acreage placed in production last year. Farmers, handicapped by the labor situation, are reducing their acreage, and consequently production, stated Colo-

Taking his own experience as an instance. Colonel Holland said that on his own farm, near Dalhas, he has been producing from 300 to 400 meat animals, cattle, hogs, sheep and goats, for the market aumully. This year he will not produce more than fifty meat animals for the market. His farm is composed of 450 acres, 250 acres of which have been in callivation in the past. He added that this year the acreage tilled will be cut to 150 acres, and this is only typical of what is being done throughout the state, it said. He stated that there will be less

than half the small grain raised in Texas this year than there was last

has slightly increased, but not enough to become a potent factor in offsetting the decrease in the production of other foodstuffs and feedstuffs.

The situation is due to the large amount of public works under construction and the high wages paid which are luring the people, especially young men, from the farms to the city he said. The conditions are unforunate, he added, but no one can blame any man for taking \$5 and working only eight hours a day when he would get a much lower figure and work from ten to twelve hours a day on the farm. He stated, however, that in the ong run the men gained nothing fin ancially by this. Regardless of the high wages and the high salaries paid in th cities, it will take everything that the man makes to keen himself and family in food, unless farm life becomes more attractive and produc-

But the producers of food and foodstuffs are awakening to the fact that they have not had a square deal and an increase commensurate with other occupations, he stated. In the future, he added, the producers are going to demand compensation based on labor hour for labor hour or in other words are going to swap hours instead of dollars. The new secretary of agriculture, E. T. Meredith, has already called attention to this matter, Colonel Holland said.

He predicted that in less than two years there will be an exodus from the city to the country, and farm life, made more attractive, will come into its own. Farming will yet become the most profitable business in the country, he predicted. He added that it takes more brains to farm right than it does to conduct a commercial business. Unless these conditions prevail, he stated, it won't be long before one will have to go to the country to hear the sound of the dinner bell.—From the Galveston News







TEXAS CROP REPORT

Winter Wheat The condition of Texas kinter wheat s estimated at 75 per cent of normal. This low condition has been caused by many adverse conditions which affected the crop since planting time. A rainy fall and winter made proper preparation and planting a problem, especialfy in the black land belt, drying weather and high winds have injured a part of the crop in the plains section, late cold weather has retarded growth and since a considerable portion of the crop has been planted late its proper development and maturity is contingent upon favorable weather conditions very late in the spring.

Some damage by green-bug is reported from Gillespie, Kerr, Collin, Grayson and a few other counties surrounding these. The most extensive damage, as reported, is from the two former counties.

Throughout the entire panhandle it appaears that the plant is well rooted and that no considerable damage has been done by blowing of the soil. Rains which fell generally over the state between the 24th and 27th of March were beneficial as surface mois ture was needed to connect the surface soil with the subsoil, which is now well supplied with moisture, and escapillarity. Unfortunately, the high winds and cool weather which accompanied and followed these rains dissipated, largely, this moisture which was for the whole insufficient. Last year at this date the condition of winter wheat was 101 per cent and the ten year average 81 per cent of normal.

The condition of rye is 77 per cent of normal. This crop has been affected by many of the conditions reported for winter wheat. The condition on this date last year was 95 per cent and the ten year average is 77 per cent of

Breeding Sows

The number of breeding sows has increased 3 per cent as compared to this date a year ago. It should be remembered, however, that there is still a marked decrease as compared to 1917. The great breeding section of the south plains of the Panhandle was almost stripped of breeding stock dur ing 1917-1818. At the beginning of 1917 the number of breeding sows in the state was 313,000 where as at pres ent there are about 290,460.

Farm Labor Supply

The present farm labor supply is 89 per cent as compared to the supply at this date last year and 71 per cent of the normal. Until the restrictions were lifted, and Mexican labor permitted to enter the state, there was an alarming scarcity which did not give a favorable outlook to the acreage prospect for the coming year.
