GROUND BROKEN FOR SOLDIERS' HOSPITAL

Austin, Texas. April 17.—During the cek ground was broken at Kerrville for the Texas World War Memorial Hospital, which is to be built with funds raised by the Benevolent War Risk Society for the care and treatment of Texas tuberculous ex-service gen, the chug of the well drill bringing the dawn of new hope for thous ands of world war heroes, who for onths have been fighting against the ravages of the white plague as best hey could, unwilling to accept help from the Federal Government where uch help meant treatment in a hosital located in some distant State far om home and loved ones.

After six months of vigorous campaigning on the part of the Benevolent War Risk Society of Texas, a fund of about \$200,000 has been raised by popular subscription, a site of 740 acres secured and a contract let by the McKenzie Construction Company of San Antonio, which concern is rushing its machinery and equipment to Kerrville and the San Antonio and Aransas Pass Railroad has agreed to complete a spur leading up to the hospital site, within the next ten days, so that building material may be placed on the grounds with the least possible delay and expense.

The first unit, which will cost approximately \$150,000 and accomodate 100 patients will consist of two large wards of thirty-two beds each and twenty bungalows of two beds each, besides an administration building, a subsistence plant, a water and sewerage disposal system, a power plant for furnishing heat and electric light to all buildings an ice factory and a laundry, equipped to care for the first quota of patients.

That the people of Texas must not think their work is done, now that the project is well under way, is the plea of Dr. C. W. Goddard, State Health Officer and vice president of the Benevolent Wark Risk Society.

Texain must not quit on the home stretch. Less than half of the money needed for the completion of the sanitarium has been raised. We must have the remainder as soon as possible declared Dr. Gaddard.
