### **Building in All** Lines Progressing

WORK GOING ON UNABATED IN REV. R. B. FREEMAN OF MUN-ALL LINES OF BUILDING IN LOCKNEY AT PRESENT

The work on the Lockney Cotton Oil Mill plant is progresing rapidly and the main building is being rushed to completeion. The brick' work on the main building is well underway and the foundation is laid on the seed house, which is the third building to be put under construction. Work will begin on the hull and lint houses within the next few days, making a total of five buildings to be erected by the oil mill company for the plant at Lockney.

The gas company workers have about completed the welding of the pipe between Lockney and Floydada and also much of the work between Lockney and Plainview, and within a short time the ditches will be dug and the pipe put into them. Work is expected to start within the city at most any time, as the men have been here for the past week who will take part in the laying of the mains and connecting the residences of the town.

#### THINGS ABOUT THE BOND ISSUE PEOPLE SHOULD KNOW

\*

There has been many questions asked anent the bonds that are to be voted on in Floyd County on August 1st, for the paving of the Lee Highway across the county. The facts below have been prepared by County Judge Wm. McGehee, and deal with how the bonds if voted, will be handled and the conditions of the county at the present. The statement of Judge McGehee follows:

#### How The Bonds Will Be Issued and Sold

475 bonds of the denomination of \$1,000.00 each. To be dated March, 1928. To be well advertised and sold to the highest bidder at Public Sale. Interest rate to be determined by bids, not to exceed 5 1-2 per cent (may be under 4 3-4 per cent, if bond market continues as at present). Bonds mature serially from 1 to 30 years (will be arranged that interest and principal payments will be nearly as possible equal throughout the time the bonds run).

Not less than \$10,000.00 deposit will be required before bids are

#### How The Issue Will Be Met

" Will be met by an ad valorem tax on all taxable property subject to taxation within Floyd County for the year 1928 and thereafter as long as any of the bonds are outstanding.

The estimated taxable value for the year 1928 is \$11,000,000.00, the approved taxable values for 1927 are \$10,764,640.00.

The tax rate to take care of the proposed bond issue for 1928 would not exceed 35c on the \$100.00 valuation according to the above.

Total Indebtedness of Floyd County \$156,599.50

You will note by the above statement that the total indebtedness of Floyd County is only \$156,599.50, possibly the least indebtedness that is held against any county in the state with anything near the population or property valuation of this county.

The county has at this time about 11,000,000.00 valuation; next year the valuation will be more than \$12,000,000.00 just to figure the industries and railroads that are under construction in the county at this time. This will mean, with a tax rate of thirty-five cents for the bond issue the first year, the county will be able to lower to about thirty cents the next year, and every time a million dollars is added to the valuation of the county the tax rate will be lowered accordingly on the bond issue. Floyd county is growing very rapidly, and Lee Highway paving program is one of the most essential projects that we can have, and which will add hundreds of new farmers and business men to the county.

The counties both east and west of Floyd County have already voted bonds to pave Lee Highway, and Floyd County should fill in the gap. It means dollars and cents to every inhabitant of the county to have Lee Highway paved across the county.




