Tihs will be the third time that the Lee Highway propostion has been carried to a vote of the people this year. The first time the bonds failed by more than 150 votes in the county. On August 1st the bonds failed to carry by 48 votes, and not more than half the votes in the county were accounted for. It is the belief of those who favor the bonds that if the people are enlightened on the propostion and urged to vote that they all vote the bonds by a good majority, as the last two campaigns were not carried on intensely.

52 LOSE LIVES PAST WEEK

There were 52 persons killed and 120 injured by accident in Texas during the weeking ending August 15, according to the report of the Texas Safety Council.

This brings the totals for the year

to 1,051 killed and 3,412 injured. As usual, automobile accidents ac counted for a large number of the deaths and injuries. Twenty persons were killed and 68 injured in automobile accidents during the past week. Ten were killed and seven tees are having another room added injured in railway accidents.
