## More Heat Less Gas

There is only one suggestion for the better use of a radiant type gas heater, beyond having a good flame, proper connections, keeping burners and heating eleneedlessly.
This suggestion is to watch the flame so that it does not GO OVER THE TOP of the radiant grid which throws out the heat.
