In his address to the House the Governor used the maximum State ax rate of 35c for general purposes and said with emphasis that the net amount available from it would not exceed about \$45,500,000. Since then he has been quoted as having said that if the total appropirations went o \$50,000,000 he would veto the enire list of money bills and send them back to an immediate session.

Already the appropriations have been long delayed and the delay is mbarassing to educational instituions as they are not able to make ontracts with faculty members, causng many instructors to leave because of the uncertainty of their salaries. The next fiscal year begins Sept. and the Legislature could not post pone making the appropriations beond that date as the State would have no money for its operation. Appropriations must be made not later than August and thirty-day delay would avail little, therefore an




